Doug was appointed as the Chief Information Officer for the Office of the Attorney General in February 2015. The Information Technology Division provides the entire technology infrastructure for approximately 1300 employees statewide in support of the Attorney General's initiatives and the operational functions of the agency, including data center services, desktop support, applications development, training and litigation support.

Prior to coming to the OAG, Doug previously served five years as the Chief Information Officer for the Florida Department of Corrections, where he led the Office of Information Technology supporting major Correctional Institutions, Community Corrections offices, Road Prisons, Work Release Centers, and Re-Entry Centers for over 22,000 employees throughout Florida. Doug also spent 17 years in service to the Judicial Branch of Florida in various technical and management roles, the last ten years serving as the Chief Technology Officer and Chief of Staff to the 2d Judicial Circuit Court of Florida.
