

Jennifer Cook Pritt, Assistant Commissioner, Florida Department of Law Enforcement



Jennifer Cook Pritt was appointed Assistant Commissioner on December 29, 2014. Assistant Commissioner Pritt oversees Capitol Police, Business Support, Criminal Justice Information Services, Information Technology Services, Professionalism and External/Legislative Affairs.

Assistant Commissioner Pritt has held a variety of sworn positions within FDLE from 1999 to 2010, including working protective operations and conducting public corruption and major fraud investigations while in the Office of Executive Investigations. In 2003, she was promoted to special agent supervisor within the Office of Statewide Intelligence. She became the assistant special agent in charge and director of the Florida Fusion Center in 2007. She left FDLE in May 2010 and served as a senior research associate at the Institute for Intergovernmental Research. In December 2011, she was named director of Criminal Justice Professionalism and she was named director of Criminal Justice Information Services in March 2014. Prior to joining FDLE, Assistant Commissioner Pritt served as an investigator with the Office of the State Attorney, Eighth Judicial Circuit, and as a police officer with the University of Florida Police Department. While at both agencies, she was assigned to work narcotics with the Special Investigations Unit and then assigned to the Drug Enforcement Task Force.

Assistant Commissioner Pritt holds both a bachelor's and master's degree from the University of Florida. She is a graduate of the Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute and has held multiple positions on professional law enforcement and intelligence policy boards. In 2010, she received a Commissioner's Medal for her contributions to intelligence operations. Assistant Commissioner Pritt has two daughters and her husband works for the Department of Justice.
