Carolyn Timmann took Office in January 2013 as the Martin County Clerk of the Circuit Court and Comptroller. She began her public service career in the state court system as a judicial assistant. She then served as a legislative aide in the Florida House of Representatives, based in Stuart. Following that service, Carolyn and her family moved to Tallahassee where she joined the Attorney General's Office as Special Assistant to Florida's first Solicitor General.

In 2006, Carolyn became Executive Deputy Chief of Staff to the Governor, overseeing military and veterans' affairs, gubernatorial councils and commissions, and statewide consumer and technology projects. In January, 2011, the Governor appointed her

as Director of Open Government, managing public records and projects to provide statewide electronic information. She resigned from that position in 2012 to return home to Martin County and seek the Office of Clerk and Comptroller.
