Sergeant Harrison was appointed to serve the Commission beginning September 25, 2020, and continued to serve until her retirement on January 3, 2025. Sergeant Harrison has, through her professional insight, personal dedication, and commitment, made significant contributions toward the development and advancement of criminal justice in Florida and has been an invaluable asset in guiding the development of Florida's criminal justice standards and training programs.

The second resolution was for Sheriff Michael Adkinson of the Walton County Sheriff's Office. Sheriff Adkinson was appointed to serve the Commission beginning September 25, 2020, to August 1, 2024. Sheriff Adkinson has, through his professional insight, personal dedication, and commitment, made significant contributions toward the development and advancement of criminal justice in Florida and has been an invaluable asset in guiding the development of Florida's criminal justice standards and training programs.

The third resolution was for Director Charles McIntosh of the College of Central Florida Criminal Justice Institute. Director McIntosh was appointed to serve the Commission beginning September 25, 2020, and continued to serve until February 14, 2025. Prior to his appointment he also served on the 2019 Officer Discipline Penalty Guidelines Task Force. Director McIntosh has, through his professional insight, personal dedication, and commitment made significant contributions toward the development and advancement of criminal justice in Florida and has been an invaluable asset in guiding the development of Florida's criminal justice standards and training programs.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Vice Chairman Lofton requested a motion to adopt the resolutions as read into the record. **COMMISSION ACTION:** Commissioner Smith moved that the Commission adopt the staff's recommendation; seconded by Commissioner Bage; motion carried.

# TRAINING CENTER DIRECTORS' ASSOCIATION REMARKS

Director Jay Romine of the Manatee Technical College, Criminal Justice Academy provided the following report from the Training Center Directors Association's (TCDA) business meeting held on February 5, 2025.

**New Directors Introduction –** Directors in attendance included Director Pierre Pacheco of the Indian River State College Criminal Justice Institute, and Director Kurt Schoeps of the Volusia Sheriff's Office Training Academy. The following directors were not in attendance but were also recognized: Director Karl Morgan of the Department of Financial Services Criminal Investigations Division Training Center, and Director Tom Melnichok of the Palm Beach State College Criminal Justice Institute.

**Funding Issues:** Director Romine gave the Commission an update on the Master Credentials List and the CAPE Industry Certification Funding List.

The <u>Master Credentials List</u> (MCL) provides industry certification funds for recruits that pass the State Officer Certification Exam (SOCE). He stated it is a vital source of funding for the training schools; however, it is slated to be removed from those industry certification funds for the 2025-2026 year. This will have a huge negative impact on anybody delivering basic recruit corrections training and their facilities. Director Romine added the association is in the process of filing appeals and writing letters of support to make sure that the funding stays in place, but they may reach out to the Commission for support because the training centers certainly need to receive that funding.

The <u>CAPE Industry Certification Funding List</u> provides industry certification funding for law enforcement up to \$1000 per certification. Director Romine stated this is another vital funding source and the Governor's budget has cut that funding by about 50 percent. He continued to say that the numbers, which had reached up to \$1000 per certification, could be reduced as much as \$400-\$500 per certification. Additionally, he said they may need to reach out to the Commission for support on this matter as well.

**High Liability Committee:** Director Romine stated that the High Liability Committee is very active and continues to be active in reviewing programs. He said it has been eight years since the "vehicle ops" curriculum has been looked at and the committee is going to start reviewing the program and cycling through it on a regular basis because things change rapidly over time.

**Resolution for Director Charles McIntosh** – Chair Romine mentioned that Director Charles McIntosh served the association well and has taken a position with the Marion County Sheriff's Office. This has opened a vacancy on the CJSTC for the position that represents the directors of training centers, which is extremely important as decisions made on training affect 100 percent of the 86,000 plus officers in the State of Florida; it's very important to have that representation in the Commission. He advised the Commission that the procedures for filling that position have been followed and the letter has been submitted to FDLE with five training center director names who have an interest in serving on the CJSTC.

# AGENDA ITEM 1: CRIMINAL JUSTICE PROFESSIONALISM UPDATES

Director Chad Brown gave the Commission an update on the following Criminal Justice Professionalism Division and legislative initiatives.

**CJST Trust Fund Update** – Director Brown updated the Commission on the CJST Trust Fund. As of December 31, 2024, the cash balance was \$7,352,518. The trust fund is dedicated solely to providing salary dollars to staff, and all other expenditures are from general revenue allocated by the Legislature. The 2024-2025 fiscal year operating budget is \$18.6 million. Director Brown was pleased to report that the revenue for this quarter, excluding exam and tuition fees, increased by \$70,072, an improvement of 1.8 percent compared to the first and second quarters of the fiscal year. The first three quarters, \$4.7 million will be disbursed for officer training, which reflects the ongoing commitment to the professional development of our law enforcement personnel.

Legislative Updates – Director Brown updated the Commission on the 2025 Legislative session.

<u>Senate Bill 1224</u> which passed in 2024, was enacted and requires officers to administer a lethality assessment when responding to domestic violence calls involving intimate partner regardless of whether an arrest was made. The lethality assessment workgroup held its final meeting in December 2024 and FDLE submitted the final report to the Legislature. If clarification is received from the legislature FDLE will bring the lethality assessment back to the CJSTC agenda.

<u>House Bill 317 and Senate Bill 517</u> does not have a direct impact on the Commission, but for the sake of awareness, it would affect how agencies conduct their investigations of law enforcement and correctional officers as part of their internal investigative process.

<u>Senate Bill 448</u> outlines a comprehensive overhaul of the administrative procedures for agency rulemaking found in chapter 120 of the Florida Statutes. This amendment to the Florida Statutes includes restrictions on agencies issuing rules and guidance without explicit statutory delegation. Director Brown stated that it would require all rules to automatically expire after eight years unless republished, and it would create a standing for challenges based on guidance documents and statements from the agency.

Director Brown reminded the Commission that changes were made to standardize the Criminal Justice Agency Profile (CJAP) report that went into effect July 1. The new report will be presented in the February agenda each year. He also stated that a new interactive dashboard for the CJAP report is being established and he is looking forward to making it available to the agencies soon.

Furthermore, in response to the request from the Commission back in August 2024, Director Brown mentioned that the FDLE Office of Criminal Justice Excellence completed an analysis of the impact of agency-based training centers versus academic-based training centers and Bureau Chief Brett Kirkland and Matthew Sharp will present the research

to the Commission.

**Acknowledgements –** Director Brown acknowledged Tammy Frick and Jo Jones as new members to the Criminal Justice Professionalism Division. He also recognized the CJP team by thanking them for their hard work, dedication, and long hours spent meeting goals every day as well as acknowledging that the work they do is very important.

 The 2024 CJAP Report contains information on officer demographics, compensation, benefits, training programs, and specialized units. The report is available on the FDLE internet site (<u>www.fdle.state.fl.us</u>). From the home page select "Quick Links". The Criminal Justice Agency Profile Report appears alphabetically in the links listed under 'Criminal Justice Professionalism Division'. 2. The 2024 CJAP Report is separated by disciplines for a comparison of compensation and benefits of responding agencies. The data was collected from surveys distributed to the agency heads of all state, county, and city law enforcement and correctional agencies, and is based on the minimum compensation for entry-level officers.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Commission staff requested that the Commission review and approve the 2024 CJAP Report. The 2024 CJAP survey results will be placed on the FDLE website and available to criminal justice agencies and the public.

**AGENDA ITEM:** REQUEST FOR VARIANCE OR WAIVER OF RULE: PETITION FOR A WAIVER OF RULE 11B-27.002(4), F.A.C., BY SHANNIOTT HUMPHERY

Bureau Chief Glen Hopkins presented this agenda item to the Commission by Shanniott Humphery, to request a waiver of Rule 11B-27.002(4)(a), F.A.C. Ms. Humphery was present and sworn in by Commission Attorney Brian Fernandes. Ms. Humphery was given an opportunity to share comments with the Commission regarding her hardship.

**RECOMMENDATION**: Commission staff recommended that the Commission DENY the petition for a waiver of Rule 11B-27.002(4)(a), F.A.C.

**COMMISSION ACTION:** Commissioner Bage moved that the Commission reject Commission staff's recommendation and APPROVE the waiver to grant Ms. Humphery 90 days from the date of the Commission's vote to gain employment and certification as a law enforcement officer; seconded by Commissioner Smith; the motion carried with one (1) opposition by Commissioner Sewell.

# **UNAGENDAED ITEMS**

Commissioner Bage spoke on Ms. Humphery's waiver request and suggested staff research the possibility of making a rule change to prevent issues like hers from happening in the future. The proposed revision would be a change to Rule 11B-27.002(4)(a), F.A.C., which states *"Within four years of the beginning date of a Commission-approved Basic Recruit Training Program, an individual shall successfully complete the program, achieve a passing score on the applicable State Officer Certification Examination, and gain employment, and certification as an officer."* Commissioner Bage further suggested that 90 days from the date of the Commission approval should be extended to 120 days. *Staff response:* Bureau Chief Hopkins advised that staff is unable to change the rule, as the 90-day period is governed by statute – not rule.

Commissioner Riedl recognized the FDLE Team (staff) for scheduling the virtual meeting and expressed thanks for their service. Vice Chairman Lofton echoed Commissioner Riedl's comments.

## **MEETING ADJOURNED**

Vice Chairman Lofton requested a motion to adjourn, and *Commissioner Jensen moved that the Commission adjourn the CJSTC meeting; seconded by Commissioner Smith; motion carried.*

Criminal Justice Training School Recertification

#### ISSUE

This agenda item is presented to the Commission to request recertification of the Commission-certified Criminal Justice Training Schools, pursuant to Rule 11B-21.002(5), F.A.C.

#### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- Section 943.12, F.S. grants the Commission the authority to certify or deny certification to any criminal justice training school requesting approval to instruct Commission-approved courses in law enforcement, correctional, or correctional probation. In September 2021 and June 2024, an on-line survey was made available to all criminal justice agencies requesting input regarding the responsiveness of their training school and how the school met the needs of their agency. Results of these surveys were forwarded to the training center directors for their review and presented to the CJST Commission.
- 2. Applications for recertification have been received and a comprehensive evaluation has been completed of each training school by a certification team consisting of the CJSTC field representative, and an appointee from the school's Local Advisory Council or the Regional Training Council. Based on the findings of the certification team, the Criminal Justice Professionalism Division is recommending recertification for the following schools for the five-year period from July 1, 2025, to June 30, 2030.

- The Commission is responsible for maintaining specialized instructor training program courses for Commissioncertified law enforcement, correctional, and correctional probation officers. Courses in the Specialized Instructor Training Program may be delivered using Criminal Justice Standards and Training Officer Training Trust Fund Monies.
- **2.** During the 2023 firearms rewrite, the subject matter expert (SME) workgroup removed semi-automatic rifle/carbine and shotgun content from the Basic Recruit Training Program's (BRTP) Criminal Justice Firearms 80-hour block to allow for more in-depth pistol instruction.
- **3.** To address this training gap, Commission staff worked with SMEs to develop optional patrol rifle and shotgun operator courses; these courses teach officers how to safely handle and operate the weapon system while also providing instructor courses to teach the long gun instructor and operator curricula.

Both long gun instructor courses contain general firearms instructor techniques found in the Specialized Instructor Course, #801, Handgun Instructor. The new instructor courses review the operator course curricula and teach instructor-students how to evaluate and remediate students on proficiency evaluations and qualifications. To successfully complete either long gun instructor course, instructor-students must pass, without remediation, a series of proficiency evaluations and qualifications similar to those found in the Handgun Instructor course. Instructor-students will not be required to complete an additional high-liability internship to earn the certification

**4.** Only students who complete the instructor courses to become Commission-certified patrol rifle or shotgun instructors will be authorized to teach those respective long gun instructor and operator courses. Additionally, they will be authorized to sign off on mandatory in-service patrol rifle or shotgun qualifications biennially, beginning July 1, 2026.

- **2.** During the 2023 firearms rewrite, the subject matter expert (SME) workgroup removed semi-automatic rifle/carbine and shotgun content from the Basic Recruit Training Program's (BRTP) Criminal Justice Firearms 80-hour block to allow for more in-depth pistol instruction.
- **3.** To address this training gap, Commission staff worked with SMEs to develop optional patrol rifle and shotgun operator courses; these courses teach officers how to safely handle and operate the weapon systems.

Both long gun operator courses expand on the material used in the 2023 BRTP Criminal Justice Firearms 80hour block with more information on shooting stances and ready positions as well as new content on mechanical offset, movement positions, and shooting from behind cover. Additionally, the Patrol Rifle Operator course will teach and require students to demonstrate how to transition from rifle to pistol during a deadly force encounter.

To successfully complete either long gun operator course, students must pass a series of proficiency evaluations and qualifications similar to those in the academy. Additionally, the Patrol Rifle Operator course will require students to complete active threat/shooter drills.

These optional courses are designed to familiarize students with the weapon systems, not to provide a certification.

**RECOMMENDATION(s):** Commission staff recommends that the Commission approve the 32-hour Specialized Course, #3026, Patrol Rifle Operator, and the 24-hour Specialized Course, #3027, Shotgun Operator, in the Specialized Training Program with an effective date of July 1, 2025.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- 1. The Commission is responsible for maintaining specialized training program courses for Commission-certified law enforcement, correctional, and correctional probation officers. Courses in the Specialized Training Program may be delivered using Criminal Justice Standards and Training Officer Training Trust Fund Monies.
- **2.** Senate Bill 1224 amended s. 741.29, F.S. to require all law enforcement officers to complete a mandatory onetime training on adopted statewide policies and procedures for administering a lethality assessment during a domestic violence call that involves an intimate partnership.
- **3.** Commission staff consulted with members with the Florida Sheriff's Association, Florida Police Chief's Association, the Department of Children and Families, Florida Partnership to End Domestic Violence, Peaceful Paths Domestic Abuse Network, the Hubbard House, and the Gabby Petito Foundation to develop policies, procedures, a lethality assessment form, and an online training necessary for implementation of the lethality assessment.

This 1-hour online training is not meant to teach law enforcement officers how to handle domestic violence calls. Instead, it explains what a lethality assessment is, when and how to administer it during a domestic violence call, the process for advising the victim of the nearest locally certified domestic violence center, and what to include in the police report and filing packet.

All law enforcement officers have until October 1, 2026, to complete the mandatory one-time training. Students who attend the Basic Recruit Training Program (BRTP) Law Enforcement Academy beginning on or after July 1, 2026, will have satisfied this requirement.

**RECOMMENDATION(s):** Commission staff recommends the Commission approve the 1-hour online Specialized Course, #3028, Lethality Assessment Training for Law Enforcement Officers in the Specialized Training Program with an effective date of May 15, 2025.

  - employing the use of alternatives to physical restraints
  - identifying signs of abuse, neglect, or exploitation

This elective, 2-hour online training is designed to teach officers how to respond to certain ADRD-related calls that they may encounter while on duty. The training includes video instruction, officer job aids, and caregiver resources to improve officers' understanding of the disease.

- 1. Three chiefs of municipal police departments nominated by the Florida Police Chiefs Association.
- 2. Three sheriffs nominated by the Florida Sheriffs Association.

3. A county jail administrator nominated by the Florida Sheriffs Association and the Florida Association of Counties.

4. A representative nominated by the State Law Enforcement Chiefs Association.

(4) The policy board shall establish administrative procedures and operational guidelines necessary to ensure that criminal justice executive training needs are identified and met through the delivery of quality instruction.

(5) Members of the policy board are entitled to reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses pursuant to s. <u>112.061</u> to the extent such expenses are associated with meetings or training activities, appropriate to the Department of Law Enforcement, and deemed necessary by the board.

(6) Seven members constitute a quorum of the board.

Request for Variance or Waiver: Request for a Waiver of Rule 11B-18.004(9), F.A.C., by Frank Rubino, Chief of Police of the Longboat Key Police Department.

#### ISSUE

This agenda item is presented to the Commission by Chief Frank Rubino to request a waiver of Rule 11B-18.004(9), F.A.C.

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- 1. Petitioner is seeking a permanent waiver of Rule 11B-18.004(9) on behalf of the Longboat Key Police Department and wishes to waive that portion of the rule that states: "Region IX. Criminal justice agencies and Commissioncertified training schools within Pasco, Pinellas, Hillsborough, and Manatee counties, and the State Attorney's Office for the Sixth and Thirteenth Judicial Circuits." Petitioner requests a waiver of the rule to allow Longboat Key Police Department to be permanently transferred to Region X.
- 2. The Town of Longboat Key is geographically located in both Manatee and Sarasota Counties with the Longboat Key Police Department being physically located in Manatee County.
- 3. Petitioner indicates that the travel time for officers to travel to the Manatee Technical College (MTC) is approximately 45 to 80 minutes while the travel time for officers to travel to the Suncoast Technical College (STC) in Sarasota County is approximately 30 to 50 minutes.
- 4. Petitioner states STC offers twice as many classes as does MTC. Attending STC will provide Longboat Key Police Department officers more training opportunities while reducing travel time and expenses.
- 5. The Region IX and Region X Regional Training Councils have approved this request. Trust fund monies allocated for the Longboat Key Police Department officers will transfer to Region X effective FY 25/26.

**RECOMMENDATION(S):** Commission staff recommends that the Commission APPROVE the petition for a waiver of Rule 11B-18.004(9), F.A.C.

I, Frank Rubino, respectfully request a permanent waiver or variance of rule 11B-18.004(9) on behalf of the Longboat Key Police Department. This rule states, "Criminal justice agencies and Commission-certified training schools within Pasco, Pinellas, Hillsborough, and Manatee counties are established as Region IX."

Due to geographical considerations and budgetary constraints, I am seeking a waiver to switch to Region X for the following reasons:

1. Geographic Location: Our small department operates in Manatee and Sarasota counties and consists of 19 sworn officers. Traveling to the Manatee County Training Institute (MCTI) takes our officers between 45 minutes to 1 hour and 20 minutes each way, while travel to Sarasota County Training (SCT) only takes 30 to 50 minutes.

2. Class Availability: SCT offers twice as many classes as MCTI, which is crucial for our agency, given our limited number of in-house instructors.

This change will significantly reduce travel time, decrease overtime expenses, and increase available staffing. Most importantly, it will enhance the training opportunities for our officers, which aligns with our primary goal.

Both the Directors of Region IX and Region X have approved this request. The financial impact on Region IX would be minimal, as we are a small agency. I request that the board consider this change effective May 15, 2025. Upon the board's approval, both Directors have agreed that funding will remain in Region IX until the end of the current Fiscal Year and will be allocated to Region X starting July 1, 2025.

The Directors and Regional Training Councils of both Region IX and Region X have approved this request.

The variance or waiver requested would benefit our agency's training division while serving the intended purpose of the rule. Thank you for your consideration.

Region IX: Manatee County Sheriff's Office St. Petersburg College

- Interest Budgets. Commission staff has approved the Operating Budget for interest accrued in FY 2023 2024 for expenditure in FY 2024 2025 for Northeast Florida Criminal Justice Center in Region V. Rule 11B-18.0071(5), F.A.C., allows criminal justice training schools to place their annual trust fund allocation into interest bearing accounts. Interest earned may be expended on trust fund related needs, subject to the following conditions:
  - A. Commission staff shall request and be granted appropriate authority from the State Comptroller.
  - B. Regional Training Councils shall submit to Commission staff for approval, a separate operating budget for accrued interest.
  - C. Expenditure of accrued interest is restricted to training costs and purchase of operating capital outlay items.
  - D. The interest shall be expended on or before June 30 of the subsequent year in which it is earned.

- **3.** Officers who have met the June 30, 2025, mandatory retraining date. The number of officers who have met the June 30, 2025, mandatory retraining requiurement date is 10,237.

#### ISSUE

This agenda item is presented to report the information maintained by ATMS, the number of agencies and training schools that access ATMS, and the available agency reports provided by ATMS.

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- 1. Automated Training Management System. ATMS maintains information of officers' employment history, statewide officer certification examinations, certifications earned, and training attended for the basic recruit training academy, advanced training courses, and salary incentive purposes. ATMS can be used by employing agencies to manage employment registrations and separations, and entry of mandatory retraining data. Commission-certified training schools enter information about classes scheduled at their facility. Reports are available on-line to print or view an officer's status.
- 2. Agencies and training schools using ATMS as of March 27, 2025, are 494 agencies. Of these agencies, 248 are police departments; 67 are sheriff's offices; 31 are correctional agencies; 48 are school or port police departments; 37 are state agencies; 48 are training schools; and 15 are selection centers. The number of individual ATMS user accounts at all agencies is 4,710.
- **3. ## ISSUE

This agenda item is presented to the Commission in compliance with the statutory requirement for staff to advise the Commission of any revision to approved basic recruit, advanced, and specialized curricula.

# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- Pursuant to section 943.17, F.S., the Commission is responsible for the development and maintenance of basic recruit, advanced, and specialized training programs for Florida law enforcement, correctional, and correctional probation officers. Section 943.17(3), F.S., provides that the Commission is responsible for the accuracy of curriculum content through the identification and revision of typographical or grammatical errors, incorrect statutory citations, or information which can be identified as inaccurate by superior references. The statute states that the Commission shall be advised of any revision, and a copy of revised curricula shall be provided to all criminal justice training schools.
- 2. Curriculum alerts were created in an ongoing effort to ensure that Florida officers receive accurate and up-todate information in curricula approved by the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission. Curriculum alerts document revisions to approved curricula that are considered critical in nature. Revisions come from several sources including subject matter experts, instructors, officers, agencies, and superior references, such as the legislature and a court of jurisdiction. Curriculum alerts are distributed to training schools and posted on the FDLE website and the Automated Training Management System.
- 3. To further formalize and document revisions to the Commission's approved curricula under s. 943.17(3), F.S., an issue is included in each quarterly meeting packet to identify the Commission courses that have been revised within the previous quarter.
- 4. The curriculum changes that are reflective of "legislative action" only will be included in this agenda item. Impacted course curricula will be distributed to the training schools and certified instructors with other Commission-approved curriculum updates.

# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- For the Fiscal Year 2024 2025, the Legislature allotted the Criminal Justice Professionalism Division \$18.6 million between general revenue and the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Trust Fund. The trust fund is only providing salary dollars for staff. All other expenditures are from general revenue.
- 2. The operating budget for officer training in Fiscal Year 2024 2025 totals **\$6,276,960**, which provides **\$80** for each of the state's 78,462 officers. Disbursements for all quarters of the fiscal year will be **\$6,276,960**.
- 3. The beginning cash balance in the trust fund on July 1, 2024, was **\$7,121,337**.
- 4. Cash balance on March 31, 2025, was \$7,767,549.
