SUBJECT: National Decertification Index

The International Association of Directors of Law Enforcement Standards and Training (IADLEST) recently released a new and improved version of the National Decertification Index, called NDI 2.0. The NDI 2.0 is a national registry of certificate or license revocation actions relating to officer misconduct. Florida participates with 28 other states in adding revocation data to the NDI 2.0. The system provides an additional source of information for pre-employment background screenings as well as other investigations.

Access to the improved system is now being extended to any criminal justice agency in the state of Florida. Agencies interested in access need only submit a request through the NDI 2.0 website at <https://www.iadlest.org/Projects/NDI20.aspx>, by clicking the Request Access button and providing the requested information. As the State of Florida representative, FDLE will be notified automatically to review and approve the request. Please note; approval of the agency administrator must be obtained by the individual making the request for access.

In the event NDI 2.0 indicates that an officer has been decertified, information concerning the circumstances for decertification must be obtained from the state where the officer was certified. Additionally, an individual decertified in another state is not necessarily barred from certification in Florida.
