SUBJECT:

Public Safety Telecommunications for Law Enforcement

On March 23, 2012, Governor Rick Scott signed into law a provision that exempts law enforcement officers serving as 911 public safety telecommunicators (PST) on an occasional or limited basis from becoming PST-certified through the Department of Health. Effective July 1, 2012, law enforcement officers serving in a temporary capacity as public safety telecommunicators are not required to complete the 232-hour course administered by the Department of Health. However, they are required to pass a public safety telecommunications examination administered by the Department of Health. This is the same examination that is used to certify public safety telecommunicators. Should an officer fail the PST examination, he or she is then required to complete a Department of Health-approved course before retaking the examination.

On May 10, 2012, the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission approved Specialized Course #1197 Public Safety Telecommunications for Law Enforcement Officers. This course can be taught at any Florida law enforcement agency by a certified 911 PST. This course is approved by the Department of Health for completion by law enforcement officers who fail the PST examination. Upon completion, the officer should submit the attached certificate to the Department of Health as proof of completion when applying to retake the PST examination. All law enforcement officers serving as 911 public safety telecommunicators on an occasional or limited basis must pass the PST exam.

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement neither administers nor accepts applications for the PST examination.
