Duty to Intervene

On February 17, 2022, the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission approved a new course, Duty to Intervene, course number 1415. This 8-hour course is part of the Specialized Training Program. It takes an unbiased, objective look into the psychology behind intervention hesitancy, and provides effective strategies for preventing and de-escalating officer misconduct at the scene. The course also reviews use of force guidelines, the protections afforded to the officer, and discusses the importance of officer wellness and its effect on those they serve.
