SUBJECT: Medical Marijuana Online Course and Resources Update

In 2018, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) released numerous medical marijuana resources, including an online course, to train patrol officers on understanding and enforcing medical marijuana laws. These resources were a culmination of contributions by subject matter experts representing city and county law enforcement agencies, a State Attorney's Office, FDLE Investigations and Forensic Science (IFS), Florida Highway Patrol, Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, and the Florida Department of Agriculture.

## The three (3) resources are:

Medical Marijuana	An online course with procedures and scenarios*

<sup>\*</sup>This course may count toward an officer's continuing education/mandatory retraining and is worth four credit hours. The reference guides indicated above are embedded in the online course and must be read as part of course completion. Officers will receive a certificate of completion at the end of the course that can be used as proof of attendance for mandatory retraining hours.
