17 graduate from Chief Executive Seminar

Committee to craft rule aimed at prejudicial behavior

In the fall of 2014, the Professionalism management team and the FDLE legal counsel began discussions about the possible need to construct rule language to address prejudicial behavior exhibited by law enforcement officers in Florida.

This discussion started as a response to the events involving police use of force across the country as well as racially charged incidents involving officers in Florida. During discussions related to a new rule, staff acknowleged the need to maintain public trust when it comes to officers who are sworn to protect and serve the public, while also preserving the first amendment rights of the officers who would be subject to the rule.

At the August 2015 Commission meeting, Dale Landry, 4th Vice President of the Northwest Florida Region of the NAACP, expressed his concerns about the lack of a Commission rule to address prejudicial behavior exhibited by officers.

After the meeting, the Commis-

sion directed staff to work with Mr. Landry to construct acceptable rule language that would address prejudicial behavior by Florida officers. FDLE legal counsel constructed new language and shared it with the Florida Police Chiefs Association, the Florida Sheriffs Association, the Florida Police Benevolent Association, and the Fraternal Order of Police. All of the aforementioned organizations responded and provided feedback regarding the draft language.

In November 2015, the Commission conducted a workshop to discuss possible rule language changes. Based on discussion at the workshop, the Commission decided to form an ad hoc committee to craft rule language associated with prejudicial behavior. The meeting was scheduled for January 25, 2016, in Lake Mary, Florida.

The *Quarterly Update* will continue to have information about possible rule language changes as this issue evolves.



SECURITY REQUIREMENTS FOR ATMS

In keeping with FDLE's policy on maintaining the integrity of the ATMS database, the following security procedures are in force:

Passwords are to be

- changed every 90 days.
- If the ATMS user does not access the database within 90 days, the system will automatically disable the user.
- The user may contact the agency's Criminal Justice Customer Service Specialist for assistance by calling 850-410-8600.

MANDATORY RETRAINING FOR 2016

By June 30, 2016, 18,269 officers are required to complete mandatory retraining. As of January 21, 2016, only 7,609 officers met the required training for Fiscal Year 2015—2016.

Any officer who fails to complete the required mandatory retraining by the deadline will be separated in ATMS effective July 1, 2016. Please also note that officers who do not complete the required mandatory retraining on or before June 30, 2016, will not be eligible to perform the duties of a criminal justice officer until the requirements are met.

FOR 2016

All officers who hold an active law enforcement certification are required to qualify on the Commission-approved 40-round course of fire at least once every two years, with the results documented on Form CJSTC-86A. The 2014–2016 cycle of qualifications is due by June 30, 2016. A total of 50,529 officers are required to complete firearms mandatory retraining by June 30, 2016. As of January 21, 2016, the number of officers who have

completed the required training for the 2014–2016 cycle is 38,501.

Any officer who does not complete the required training by the deadline will be separated in ATMS effective July 1, 2016. Please also note that officers who do not complete the required firearms mandatory retraining on or before June 30, 2016, are ineligible to perform the duties of a criminal justice officer until the requirement is met.

STATE OFFICER CERTIFICATION EXAM

At each quarterly meeting of the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission, results for the State Officer Certification Examination (SOCE) are reported as part of the informational agenda. The full report for the first quarter of FY 2015–16, July through September, 2015, is included in the November 2015, meeting book and can be viewed at the Commission's website: http://www.fdle.state.fl.us/Content/home.aspx; under RESOURCES select "For Criminal Justice," and then click on "Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission."
