CJSTC APPROVES BASIC RECRUIT TRAINING PROGRAMS FOR SPECIAL OPERATIONS RECRUITS

Section 943.10, Florida Statutes, was recently amended to create a pathway to criminal justice certification for certain special operations forces members. This act went into effect July 1, 2018. Members who served for a minimum of 5 years and have no more than a 4-year break in special operations forces experiences can apply for exemption from basic recruit training.

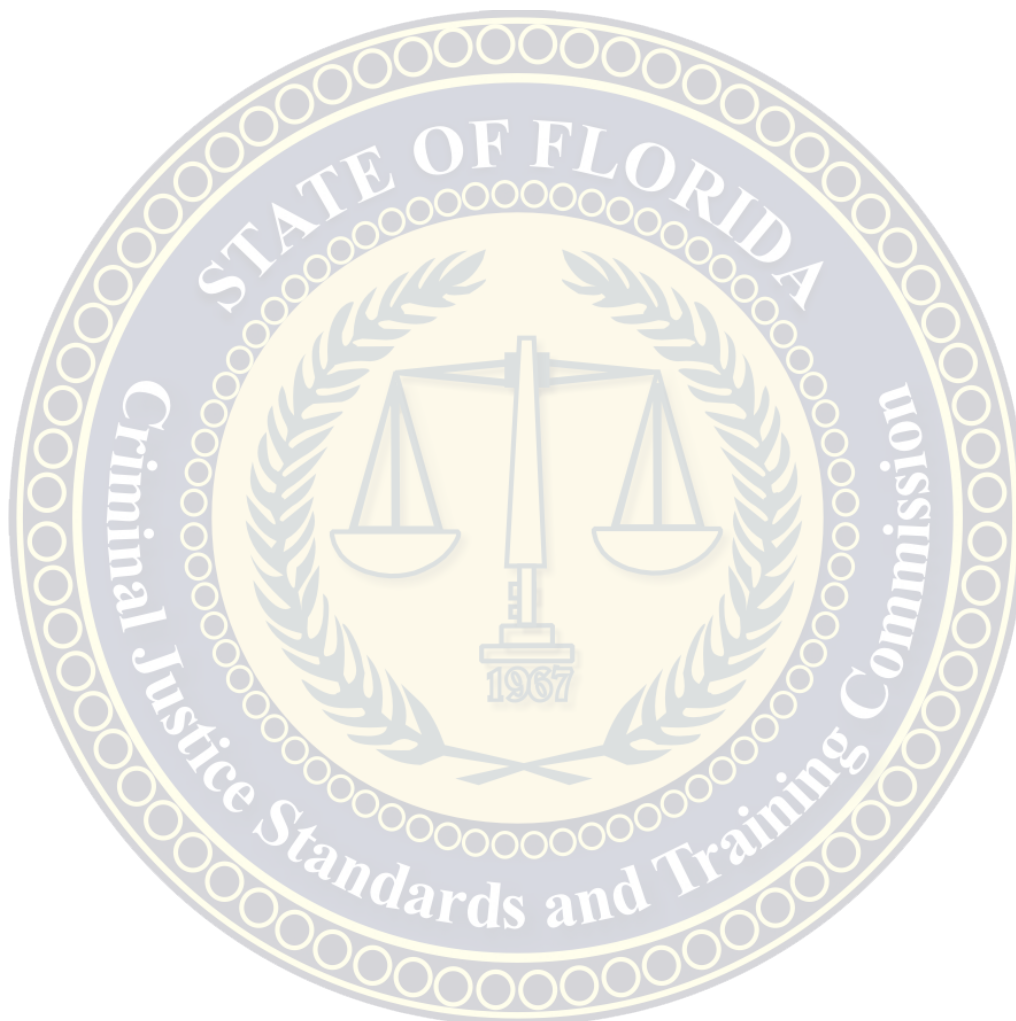
The Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission approved three new programs for recruits with special operations forces experience. A workgroup consisting of representatives from the Training Center Directors Association, FDLE staff, basic recruit instructors, former military special operations forces members and criminal justice agency representatives made recommendations for basic recruit training that allow former special operations forces members to take a shortened version of the basic academy. Recruits will have to show proficiency on specific high liability courses and complete the rest of the academy. There are programs for each of the disciplines: Law Enforcement, Corrections and Correctional Probation.

The Commission approved the following programs with an effective date of August 2, 2018:

- The Florida Basic Recruit Training Program: Law Enforcement Basic Training for Special Operations Forces Recruits, #3007 (490 hours)
- The Florida Basic Recruit Training Program: Corrections Basic Training for Special Operations Forces Recruits, #3008 (214 hours)
- The Florida Basic Recruit Training Program: Correctional Probation Officer Basic Training for Special Operations Forces Recruits, #3009 (344 hours)

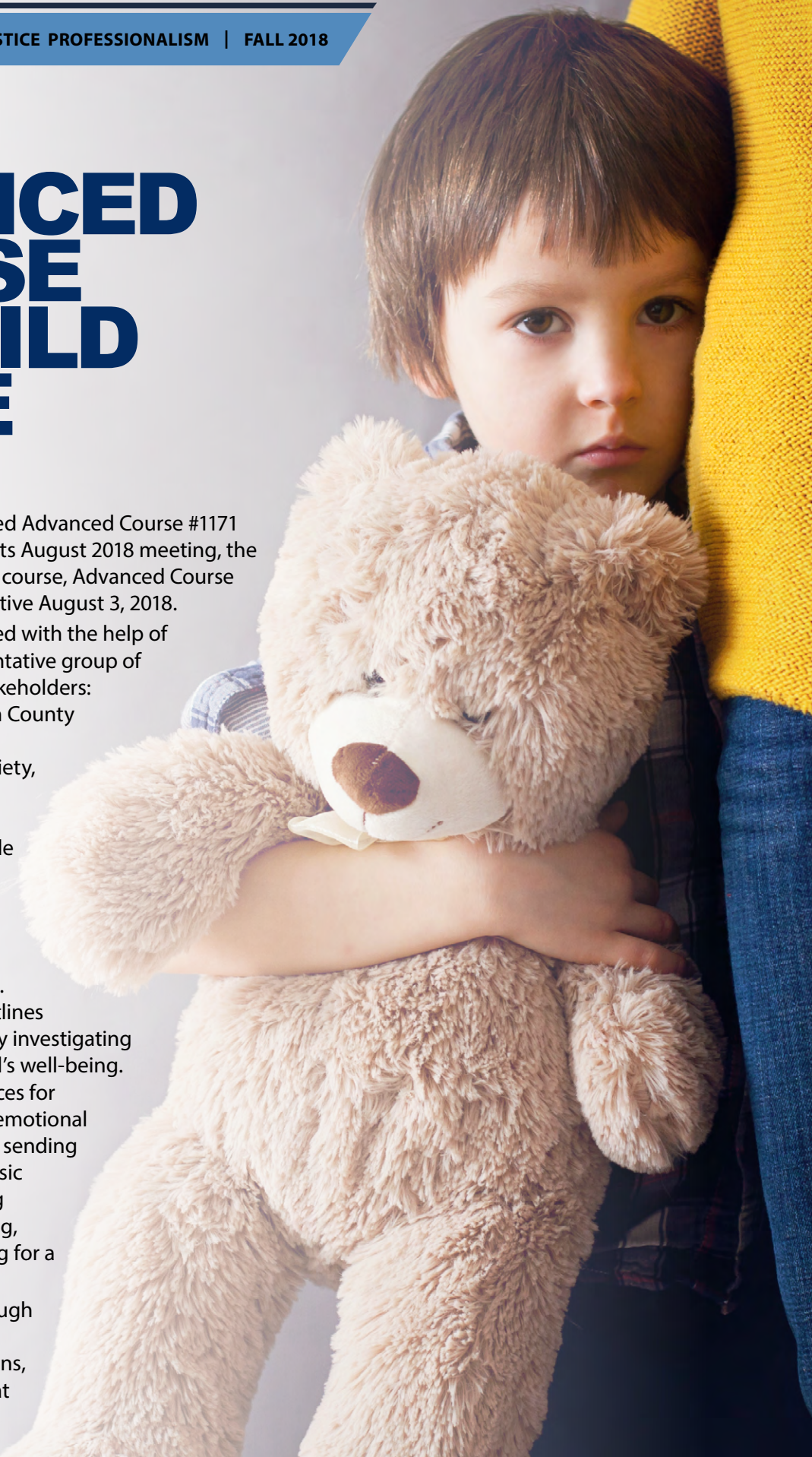
NEW ADVANCED COURSE ON CHILD ABUSE

In May 2017, the Commission adopted Advanced Course #1171 Child Sex Crimes Investigations. At its August 2018 meeting, the Commission adopted a companion course, Advanced Course #1172 Child Abuse Investigations, effective August 3, 2018.

This new 40-hour course was developed with the help of subject matter experts from a representative group of criminal justice agencies and other stakeholders: Alachua County Sheriff's Office, Marion County Sheriff's Office, Broward County State Attorney's Office, Children's Home Society, Department of Children and Families, Department of Health, Network of Children's Advocacy Centers, Gainesville Police Department and Tallahassee Police Department.

Child Abuse Investigations is a trauma-informed and victim-centered approach to child abuse investigations. In contrast to the retired courses, it outlines task-oriented procedures for effectively investigating these cases while focusing on the child's well-being. The topics covered include best practices for recognizing child abuse (i.e., physical, emotional and neglect), responding to the scene, sending the child for a medical exam and forensic interview, collecting and corroborating evidence, notetaking and report writing, interviewing the suspect and preparing for a successful prosecution.

NEW AND UPDATED RESOURCES FOR MEDICAL MARIJUANA

In January 2018, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) released Medical Marijuana in Florida: A Law Enforcement Reference Guide. The document summarized sections of Florida Statutes and administrative rules related to medical marijuana and law enforcement.

In March, FDLE staff met with subject matter experts representing city and county law enforcement agencies, a State Attorney's Office, FDLE Investigations, Florida Highway Patrol, Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and the Florida Department of Agriculture. The group identified procedures and created scenarios to train patrol officers on enforcement of medical marijuana laws.

The August 2018 release includes four products:

- Reference Guide (UPDATED): includes a new section on enforcement procedures.
- Medical Marijuana (NEW): an online course with procedures and scenarios (30-40 minutes).
- Quick Reference (NEW): list of medical marijuana violations, charges and penalties.
- Products (NEW): links to medical marijuana product lists/images and Department of Health resources.

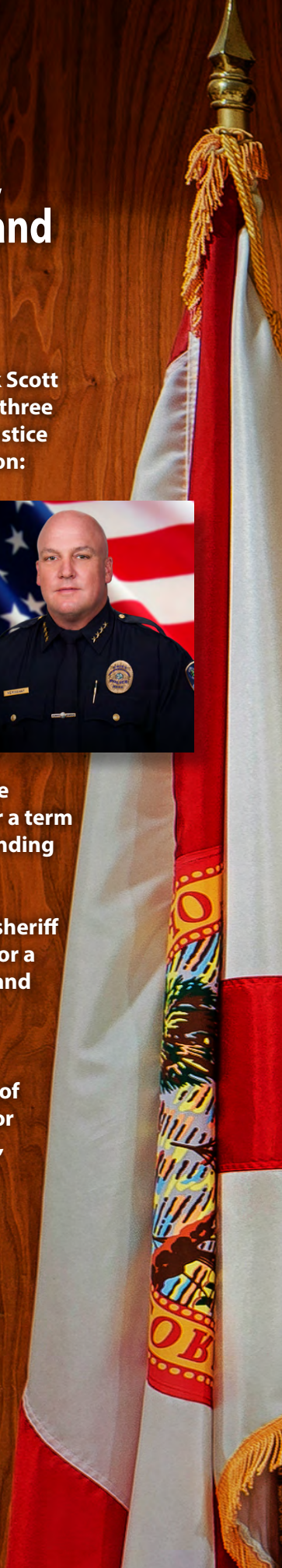
