Governor Scott Appoints Four to Commission

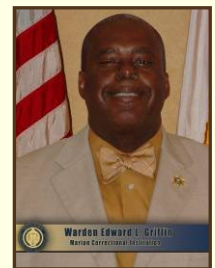
On August 1, Governor Rick Scott announced the appointment of four members to the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission. With the addition of these members, the CJSTC has its full complement of nineteen commissioners.

The appointment of **West Melbourne Police Chief Brian K. Lock** marks his second to this commission in recent years; he served previously from November 2004 to August 2008. Commissioner Lock's term began on August 2 and will end on August 1, 2015. He succeeds Chief Gerald Monahan of Port Orange Police Department whose eight years (two terms) on the commission ended on August 1.



Chief Steven Steinberg from the City of Aventura Police Department was appointed to a one-year term on the commission, beginning on August 2, 2011, and ending on August 1, 2012. Commissioner Steinberg, the police chief in Aventura since 1997, has been a law enforcement officer for 35 years.

Warden Edward L. Griffin of the Marion Correctional Institution succeeds Warden Mary E. Holcomb of the Hernando Correctional Institution, who completed a four-year term on August 1. Commissioner Griffin, a 26-year corrections professional, has been a warden since October 2008. He will serve a four-year term beginning August 2, 2011, and ending August 1, 2015.



Captain Bennie G. Coleman, the division commander at the Columbia County Sheriff's Office Detention Facility, was appointed for a term beginning August 2, 2011, and ending August 1, 2015. Commissioner Coleman has been a jail administrator for the past two years and has over 30 years experience as a corrections professional.

Professionalism Program Staff News

In the last few months, four new members have joined the Bureau of Training in the Curriculum Section.

On July 8, **Research & Training Specialist Lisa LeFiles** transferred from FDLE's Crime Information Bureau. As a former educator, the skills and experience she gained in the classroom will be an asset to the Curriculum team.

Joining the Curriculum Section on July 26 was **Research & Training Specialist Leah Cassorla**. Leah edits CJSTC curricula while also pursuing a Ph.D. in Composition and Rhetoric at Florida State University.

Research & Training Specialist Angela Meredith joined the Curriculum Section's editing group on August 29. Angela previously worked at Florida State University where she was a production coordinator for an academic journal.

The latest member to join the Curriculum writing team is **Research & Training Specialist Alisha Evans**, who began on September 2. Alisha is also new to FDLE; she was previously employed with the state's Department of Health as a medical disability examiner.



Field Test Approved for New Correctional Basic Recruit Program

THE BUREAU OF TRAINING began a project in 2009 to rewrite the Traditional Correctional Basic Recruit Training Program by conducting the largest Correctional Officer Job Analysis ever done in the United States. In addition to interviewing officers from 20 different jails and facilities, and shadowing them on the job, over 16,000 officers validated the job tasks through a survey. Using almost 100 correctional officers, supervisors, certified instructors, and training center coordinators, staff completed an instructional analysis and scoped topics and objectives into eight new courses, plus the existing three high liability courses, to make up the new program.

Most significant, the program was reduced from 552 to 420 hours by closely following the job analysis. Practical exercises are interspersed throughout the courses to provide hands-on experience to recruit officers.

At the August quarterly meeting, the Commission approved a draft of the new Florida CMS Correctional Basic Recruit Training Program and agreed to field test the program beginning in October, with a goal of further reducing the hours to 400. The following training schools will run field test training academies to evaluate the new curriculum:

- Department of Corrections at 6 academy locations
- College of Central Florida
- Manatee Sheriff's Office
- Polk State College
- St. Johns River Community College
- Withlacoochee Technical Institute

Instructors and training coordinators at these schools will provide feedback about the program, including course content, hours, role-play exercises, and overall effectiveness. The Bureau of Training will use this information to improve the curriculum and recommend the final program hours to the Commission in February 2012.

The curriculum will be published in a comprehensive textbook designed to train basic recruits to perform the job of a certified correctional officer in a state prison or county jail facility. Full implementation of the program will take place on July 1, 2012.

Commission Approves Revisions of Post Basic Courses

AT THE AUGUST QUARTERLY MEETING, the Commission approved revised versions of four post basic courses:

- Organized Crime, Advanced Course 054 (40 hours), was rewritten to educate officers about the global problem of organized crime today and how it affects the world economy.
- Financial Fraud Investigations, Advanced Course 1154 (40 hours), was updated to identify the latest trends in financial fraud affecting individuals and organizations. The course explores new investigative techniques through the use of technology.
- Domestic Intervention, Advanced Course 091 (40 hours), was revised to provide an understanding of the problematic, legal, investigative, and evidentiary aspects of domestic violence for officers and investigators with limited experience in this area. The course also informs officers about the proper use of the *Notice of Legal Rights for Victims of Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Repeat Violence, Sexual Violence* brochure and the *Sexual Battery—Victim's Rights and Services* brochure.
- Domestic Violence, Specialized Course 1136 (8 hours), is a shortened version of Advanced Course 091 and is ideal as a refresher course or in-service training.

All four courses have an effective date of October 1, 2011, and are now available on ATMS.

Legislative Action Results in Revision of Victims' Rights Brochures

FLORIDA STATUTES REQUIRE OFFICERS to provide domestic violence victims written notification informing them of their rights for legal action, protection, and services. During the 2011 legislative session, revisions were made to the information required in the brochures. The two brochures available for victims of abuse are:

- ***Notice of Legal Rights and Remedies for Victims of Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Repeat Violence, Sexual Violence***
- ***Sexual Battery—Victim's Rights and Services***

STATUS UPDATE: *Computer Based Testing*

FDLE'S EXAM SECTION and Information Resource Management staff are working with McCann Associates to implement computer based delivery of the State Officer Certification Examination (SOCE). The computer based delivery will offer several advantages over the current, paper-and-pencil, process:

- Students will know their results immediately after the exam.
- Results will be available to agencies in ATMS shortly after each exam.
- Students will be able to work directly with the test site to schedule, reschedule, or retake the exams.
- There will be no waiting period to retake the exam.

The exam process will be nearly paperless as ATMS will serve as the official source for exam results. Students will, however, be given an ***unofficial*** printout of their results at the conclusion of their test.

Some noteworthy changes to the exam process include:

- Exam registration will be online only; no paper applications will be accepted for the computer based SOCE.
- Only eligible students will be able to register for the SOCE; i.e. students must have a "P" grade for the course in ATMS prior to registering.
- Students will no longer be sent a CJSTC-516 "Applicant State Officer Certification Examination Overall Test Results" form. Agencies will be able to verify exam results in ATMS.

The Exam Section will hold paper-and-pencil based exams as scheduled in October while conducting limited pilot testing on the computer based system. The full rollout of computer based testing is scheduled for November 2012. This schedule is subject to changes arising from the quality assurance and pilot testing processes.

*State Officer Certification Examination Statistics
Fourth Quarter, FY 2010-11*

At each quarterly meeting of the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission, results for the State Officer Certification Examination (SOCE) are reported as part of the informational agenda. During this time period, students from Broward College, Florida State College, and Sarasota County Technical Institute achieved a 100% pass rate on the Florida CMS Law Enforcement SOCE on their first attempt. Sarasota County Technical Institute achieved a 100% pass rate for students taking the Correctional SOCE for the first time.

Training schools may access the SOCE results for their students via ATMS. The report contains the name, examination information, type of training completed and results for each student from that school for the selected time frame. To run the report after logging in to ATMS, select the **Administration** button from the choices on the left side of the screen. Then select **Reports** and scroll down to **Training Center Reports**. The report is entitled **Student Results by School**.

Deputies and Officers Receive D.A.R.E. Training

Twenty-Seven Certified or Re-Certified

From August 22 to September 2, 2011, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement provided D.A.R.E. Officer Training to 27 deputy sheriffs and police officers from 15 different law enforcement agencies throughout the State of Florida. The training took place at the Conference Center at Florida Public Safety Institute/Pat Thomas Law Enforcement Academy in Havana, Florida.

The 80-hour training certified 24 new D.A.R.E. officers and re-certified three others to allow them to begin teaching D.A.R.E. to both elementary and middle school students. This course also certifies the officers as School Resource Officers (SRO).

A typical D.A.R.E. officer teaches over 200 students a week in any given semester.

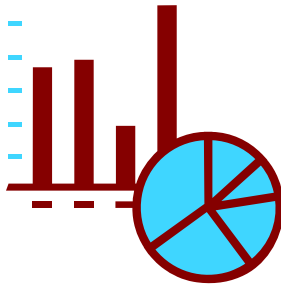

SECURITY REQUIREMENTS

In keeping with FDLE's policy on maintaining the integrity of the ATMS database, the following security procedures have been implemented. Passwords are to be changed every 90 days and must have at least 8 characters, with at least one capital letter, some lower case letters and a number. If the ATMS user does not access the database within 90 days, the system will automatically disable the user. The user may contact the agency's Criminal Justice Customer Service Specialist for assistance.



MANDATORY RETRAINING FOR 2012

20,004 officers are required to complete mandatory retraining by June 30, 2012. As of June 27, 2011, the number of officers who have met the required training for 2011-2012 is **1,816**.



Officers who do not complete the required mandatory retraining on or before June 30, 2012 will be ineligible to perform the duties of a criminal justice officer until the requirements are met. The officer will be separated in ATMS effective July 1, 2012.
