TRAINING FOCUS: Updated Advanced Courses

The Bureau of Training, Curriculum Development Section, has been working to update most of the 48 courses comprising the Advanced Training Program. The revised courses include practical exercises and/or scenarios designed to help students apply the knowledge and skills taught in the course. Officers taking an advanced training course may receive salary-incentive payments pursuant to CJSTC Rule 11B-14.003, F.A.C.

The following courses were approved by the Commission in February and will become effective April 1, 2011.

011 Developing and Maintaining a Sound Organization (40 hours)

This course provides officers with a general understanding of how a sound organization works and gives a broad understanding of organizational theory and practice. Officers will also learn about various organizational structures and how to plan for and manage anticipated and unexpected change.

013 Building and Maintaining a Sound Behavioral Climate (40 hours)

Students taking this course will learn strategies for fostering a good behavioral climate in their agency. They will examine organizational culture, learn to manage human resource issues and job performance, and identify principles of successful communication and leadership.

073 Community and Human Relations (40 hours)

In this course, students are exposed to the culturally diverse communities they serve and learn various methods of responding to and engaging in community-based policing practices and developing problem-solving partnerships.

080 Computers and Technology in Criminal Justice (40 hours)

Criminal Justice officers with limited technical experience will learn the benefits of using computers and technology when managing a criminal justice agency's operations.

Updated Advanced Courses

1153 Computer Crime Investigations (40 hours)

This course provides criminal justice officers with the techniques necessary to investigate a variety of computer crimes and the procedures required to ensure evidence preservation.



1165 Spanish for Criminal Justice Professionals (40 hours)

This course is intended to improve officer performance and safety by providing students with basic Spanish language concepts and knowledge of common words and phrases, particularly related to criminal justice activities. The course has a new format with a course guide and most handouts have been incorporated into the lesson as attachments.

**098 Basic Traffic Homicide Investigations
087 Advanced Traffic Homicide Investigations
088 Traffic Crash Reconstruction**

These three courses are a series in the Advanced Training Program designed to teach law enforcement officers how to investigate a fatal traffic crash to determine the circumstances and contributing factors of the crash. The courses rely heavily on mathematical formulas and physics concepts. Each course is 80 hours in length. Because each course builds on the previous instruction, the courses should be taken beginning with 098, then proceeding to 087, and completing the series with 088.

In addition to the updated courses, one new course was approved by the Commission and was effective on February 3, 2011:

1188 Field Training Officer Course for Correctional Probation Officers (40 hours)

This new course introduces correctional probation officers to various ways of evaluating and documenting the performance of trainees during the field training period. The importance of agency policies and procedures is emphasized throughout the program in order to achieve the intended field training objectives.

This course completes the field training officer series in the Advanced Training Program. The other two courses, 809 CMS Field Training Officer Program Course (New name pending rule promulgation: Field Training Officer Course for Law Enforcement Officers) and 1100 Field Training Officer Course for Correctional Officers, were updated in 2010.

State Officer Certification Examination Statistics September through November, 2010

At each quarterly meeting of the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission, results for the State Officer Certification Examination (SOCE) are reported as part of the informational agenda. The SOCE was administered 9 times in the months of September through November, 2010. The following represents the overall results for the period:

During this time period, students from the Broward Community College, Florida Keys Community College, Lake Technical Center, Florida State College, St. Petersburg College and Washington-Holmes Technical Center achieved a 100% pass rate on the Florida CMS-Law Enforcement SOCE on their first attempt.

On the Corrections SOCE, Brevard Community College, Indian River State College and Polk State College achieved a 100% pass rate for students taking the SOCE for the first time.

SOCE Monthly School Reports

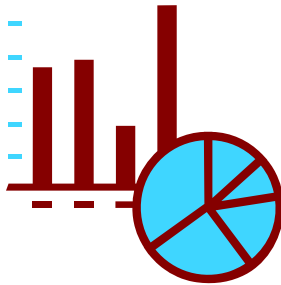

SECURITY REQUIREMENTS

In keeping with FDLE’s policy on maintaining the integrity of the ATMS database, the following security procedures have been implemented. Passwords are to be changed every 90 days and must have at least 8 characters, with at least one capital letter, some lower case letters and a number. If the ATMS user does not access the database within 90 days, the system will automatically disable the user. The user may contact the agency’s Criminal Justice Customer Service Specialist for assistance.



MANDATORY RETRAINING FOR 2011

18,823 officers are required to complete mandatory retraining by June 30, 2011. As of February 28, 2011, the number of officers who have met the required training for 2010-2011 is 10,663.



Officers who do not complete the required mandatory retraining on or before June 30, 2011 will be ineligible to perform the duties of a criminal justice officer until the requirements are met. The officer will be separated in ATMS effective July 1, 2011.
