

LARCENY

Larceny is the taking of the personal property of another with intent to permanently deprive him of ownership.

All larcenies and thefts resulting from pocket picking, purse snatching, shoplifting, larceny from a motor vehicle, larceny of motor vehicle parts and accessories, theft of bicycle, larceny from buildings and from any coin operated machines are included in this category. Embezzlements, illegal conversions, larceny by a bailee, frauds or bad check cases are not included.

1977—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 324,121 larcenies was reported by law enforcement agencies for the year 1977.

Reported larcenies accounted for 63.4 percent of nonviolent crimes and 57.0 percent of all index offenses reported.

The larceny rate for Florida for the year amounted to 3,718.1 per 100,000 population.

There were 61,939 larcenies cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared. This represents a clearance rate of 19.1 percent statewide.

The age group of 25 to 29 years was responsible for 9.5 percent of persons arrested for larceny. Males accounted for 66.3 percent of persons arrested for all categories of larceny.

Of all persons arrested for larceny, 63.8 percent were white, 35.5 percent were Negro and 0.7 percent were of other races.

During the year 1977, the value of property stolen in actual offenses of larceny totaled \$63,845,443. This constitutes 32.4 percent of the total value of property stolen.

1978—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 338,095 larcenies was reported by law enforcement agencies for the year 1978.

Reported larcenies accounted for 62.4 percent of nonviolent crimes and 55.7 percent of all index offenses reported.

The larceny rate for Florida for the year amounted to 3,770.3 per 100,000 population.

There were 64,171 larcenies cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared. This represents a clearance rate of 19.0 percent statewide.

The age group of 25 to 29 years was responsible for 8.6 percent of persons arrested for larceny. Males accounted for 66.2 percent of persons arrested for all categories of larceny.

Of all persons arrested for larceny, 66.0 percent were white, 33.8 percent were Negro and 0.2 percent were of other races.

During the year 1978, the value of property stolen in actual offenses of larceny totaled \$80,047,516. This constitutes 32.0 percent of the total value of property stolen.

1979—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 377,896 larcenies was reported by law enforcement agencies for the year 1979.

Reported larcenies accounted for 62.3 percent of nonviolent crimes and 55.5 percent of all index offenses reported.

The larceny rate for Florida for the year amounted to 4,087.5 per 100,000 population.

There were 69,820 larcenies cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared. This represents a clearance rate of 18.5 percent statewide.

The age group of 25 to 29 years was responsible for 8.8 percent of persons arrested for larceny. Males accounted for 68.1 percent of persons arrested for all categories of larceny.

Of all persons arrested for larceny, 67.3 percent were white, 32.4 percent were Negro and 0.2 percent were of other races.

During the year 1979, the value of property stolen in actual offenses of larceny totaled \$106,707,831. This constitutes 31.3 percent of the total value of property stolen.
