Objective 1:

Improve criminal history record systems in U.S. states and territories to support background checks for the purposes of identifying ineligible firearm purchases and persons ineligible to hold positions involving children, the elderly, or the disabled.

- (a) How many criminal history records, manual and automated, are in the state's criminal history file as of the last day of the reporting period?
- (b) How many fully automated records (records for which the master name index and entire criminal history are automated, are in the state's criminal history file as of the last day of the reporting period?
- (c) How many records are available through the III system, as of the last day of the reporting period?
- (d) How many arrests were reported to the repository by mail, fax, or non-automated electronic submission as of the last day of the reporting period?
- (e) How many arrests were reported to the repository by automated interface, as of the last day of the reporting period?
- (f) How many court dispositions were reported to the repository by mail, fax, or non-automated electronic submission, as of the last day of the reporting period?
- (g) How many court dispositions were reported to the repository by automated interface, as of the last day of the reporting period?
- (h) How many state repository records were submitted to the FBI NICS Indices as of the last day of the reporting period?

Objective 2:

Ensure the development of the infrastructure connects each state's and tribe's record systems to national records, and to connect each state's background check databases to other states.

- (a) How many 10-print records were submitted to the FBI's NGI, as of the last day of the reporting period?
- (b) How many active records were submitted to the FBI's POF, as of the last day of the reporting period?
- (c) How many active records were submitted to the FBI's Wanted Persons File, as of the last day of the reporting period?
