A MOTION WAS MADE, SECONDED, AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY FOR THE COMMISSION TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER 6, 2013, MEDICAL EXAMINERS COMMISSION MEETING.

ISSUE NUMBER 1: INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

- Status Report: MEC Appointment: Mr. Krauss reported that Dr. Nelson was appointed by Gov on Feb 13, 2014 thru July 1, 2016. Mr. Krauss congratulated Dr. Nelson on his appointment, and welcomed him back to the Commission.
- Status Report: District 4 Search Committee: Ms. Corey reported that five applications were received and that all five names were currently being vetted. Due to an ongoing high profile criminal case, Ms. Corey said that she requested a 90-day extension, which was granted by MEC Chairman Dr. Hyma.
- Ms. Edwards reported that Surveys and assessments for districts 15 through 24 were sent to
 the constituents of those districts in January 2014, to obtain feedback on the quality of
 services provided by the medical examiners in those districts. The response rate to date is
 low, and reminders will be sent to the constituents that have not responded. The results will
 be presented to the MEC at its second meeting in 2014.
- 2013 Interim Drugs in Deceased Persons Report: Ms. Santiago reported that most of the districts have submitted their data for the 2013 Interim Drugs in Deceased Persons Report, and that the report should be released in April, 2014.

- 2013 Annual Workload Report: Ms. Santiago reported that the 2013 Annual Workload report
 will be released later in the year, and to please submit data as soon as possible. Ms. Santiago
 reminded everyone to still submit data on the old form, and that the new form will be used
 beginning with the 2014 Annual Workload Report data.
- Coverdell Grant: Ms. Santiago reminded those in attendance that the funds for the 2013
 Coverdell grant would be released soon, but districts should not begin spending money on
 requested items until the funds were released. She also informed everyone that solicitations
 will soon begin for the 2014 Coverdell Grant.
- Bills Filed for the 2014 Legislative Session: Mr. Martin reported House Bill 301, which is sponsored by Representative Spano and co-sponsored by Reps. Baxley and Roberson, was filed for consideration by the Florida Legislature in the 2014 session. The purpose of this bill is to prohibit the medical examiner, or their respective counties, from charging a member of the public or anyone licensed under chapter 497 a fee for an examination, investigation, or autopsy performed pursuant to s. 406.11. A companion bill, SB 584, has also been filed, and both bills are expected to pass.

ISSUE NUMBER 2: ORGAN PROCUREMENT ORGANIZATION ANNUAL REPORT 2013

Mr. Larry Cochran of LifeQuest presented the Organ Procurement Report for 2013. Mr. Cochran reported that there were no denials for whole organ donors, but there was one denial for partial organ donation. Mr. Cochran noted that the cooperation with Florida's medical examiners was outstanding, and that all of the organ procurement organizations were pleased with their relationship with the districts.

ISSUE NUMBER 3: DATA QUALITY ASSURANCE COMMITTEE UPDATE

District 12 Medical Examiner Russell Vega, M.D., readdressed the reporting of morphine in heroin deaths when the decedent was not taking morphine independently. Similarly, reporting metabolites has been questioned unless they are taken independent of the parent drug. Dr. Vega presented several examples explaining the proper reporting of metabolites and their parent drugs.

ISSUE NUMBER 4: THE EFFECT OF FLORIDA'S PRESCRIPTION DRUG MONITORING PROGRAM ON OXYCODONE-CAUSED MORTALITY

Mr. Chris Delcher gave a presentation regarding current trends in Oxycodone deaths following the PDMP and the shutting down of pill mills in Florida. Mr. Delcher showed that deaths due to Oxycodone were down significantly in the past two years, which was not unexpected. When asked if his data was available to the districts, Mr. Delcher explained that this data was being compiled as part of his doctoral dissertation, and was not ready for release at this time.

ISSUE NUMBER 5: UNIDENTIFIED DECEASED INITIATIVE

Mr. Culbertson informed the Commission and those in attendance that one success story was reported during the past quarter. In early 2013, District 20 took possession of unidentified remains that were found in early stages of decomposition with insect activity and multiple large defects of skin, which made the underlying bones visible. The body was located in a mangrove area off of State Road 92 and discovered by a fisherman.

In April of 2013, District 20 received a letter from the University of North Texas providing DNA identification between an unidentified male and Roman Reese. Mr. Reese's nuclear genetic profile was obtained from a convicted offender specimen reported by FDLE. Collier County Sheriff's office compared Mr. Reese's finger prints to that of District 20's unidentified male, which were found to be a match as well. Contact was made with the decedent's mother who resides in Miami and his skeletal remains were released.

ISSUE NUMBER 6: MASS FATALITY PLANS

Mr. Krauss reminded the District Medical Examiners that hurricane season is approaching, and now is a good time to make sure that all mass fatality plans are up to date. He informed them that, if needed, a template is available on the MEC website.

ISSUE NUMBER 7: 2014 EDUCATIONAL CONFERENCE

Dr. Barbara Wolf informed the Commission District 5 will be hosting the 41ST Annual Florida Association of Medical Examiner Educational Conference. The conference will be held July 16-18, 2014 in Orlando at the Hyatt Regency Grand Cypress. The room rate will be \$137.00 per night with the resort fee waived, and reduced self-parking fees

ISSUE NUMBER 8: OTHER BUSINESS

Mr. Krauss read the following resolution for former MEC member, District 12 Medical Examiner Russell S. Vega, M.D.

WHEREAS, Chapter 406, Florida Statutes, known as "The Medical Examiners Act," created the Medical Examiners Commission by its legislative enactment in 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Medical Examiners Commission plays a vital role in support of Florida's criminal justice system and in service to the families of the deceased by determining both the cause and the manner of death, and by protecting the public health of the citizens of Florida; and

WHEREAS, Russell S. Vega, M.D., has been the District Twelve Medical Examiner since 2003, serving Sarasota, Manatee and DeSoto Counties; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Vega was appointed by the Governor of Florida to the Medical Examiners Commission in 2008, as one of the Medical Examiner representatives, and during his tenure he has provided distinguished public service to the Medical Examiners Commission and to the citizens of Florida; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Vega was a member of the working committee of the revised Practice Guidelines for Florida Medical Examiners, a document that contains the current practice standards for Florida medical examiners and is incorporated in Florida Administrative Code 11G; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Vega has provided instruction for law enforcement in child death investigation seminars for Safe Kids, an organization dedicated to preventing childhood injuries, as well as providing instruction to TideWell Hospice, Kiwanis and the local Emergency Medical Services Department; and



2014 LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Bills of Interest - 2014 Legislative Session

Passed Bills

<u>House Bill 697</u> "Relating to Controlled Substances"—The bill amends F.S. 893.03, by adding four new synthetic cannabinoids and two new phenethylamines to Schedule I of Florida controlled substance schedules. As a result, the criminal penalties relating to the possession, sale, manufacture, delivery, etc., of controlled substances now apply to these synthetic substances.

The substances added are as follows:

AB-PINACA (N-(1-Amino-3-methyl-1-oxobutan-2-yl)-1-pentyl-IH-indazole-3-carboxamide).

AB-FUBINACA (N-(1-Amino-3-methyl-1-oxobutan-2-yl)-1-310 (4-fluorobenzyl)-IH-indazole-3-carboxamide).

ADB-PINACA(N-(1-Amino-3,3-dimethyl-1-oxobutan-2-yl)-1-pentyl-1H-indazole-3-carboxamide).

Fluoro ADBICA (N-(1-Amino-3,3-dimethyl-1-oxobutan-2-314 yl)-1-(fluoropentyl)-1H-indole-3-carboxamide).

25B-NBOMe (4-bromo-2,5-dimethoxy-N-[(2-methoxyphenyl)methyl]-benzeneethanamine).

2C-C-NBOMe(4-chloro-2,5-dimethoxy-N-[(2-methoxyphenyl)methyl]-benzeneethanamine).

Failed Bills

<u>CS/House Bill 301</u> - Medical Examiners: Clarifies circumstances under which case must be referred to district medical examiner for determination of cause of death; prohibits user fees for specified services.

This Bill died in Local & Federal Affairs Committee on Friday, May 02, 2014.

<u>Senate Bill 584</u> - Medical Examiners: Clarifying the circumstances under which a case must be referred to the district medical examiner for an investigation and determination of cause of death; prohibiting medical examiners from charging user fees for specified services involving a determination of cause of death.

This Bill died in Health Policy on Friday, May 02, 2014.

Thank you for your April 24th letter to me concerning the recently announced resignation of E. Hunt Scheuerman, M.D. as the District Medical Examiner for Monroe County, effective June 20, 2014.

As of that date a vacancy will exist as District Medical Examiner. Pursuant to Florida Statutes §406.15 – Designation of substitute in absence of official examiner, "...the state attorney of the county may appoint a competent physician to act in their stead." As we discussed on the telephone yesterday, you appear to be well along in lining up an interim medical examiner and I anticipate that you will have named Dr. Scheuerman's interim replacement by June 20th.

Florida Administrative Code Chapter 11G-5.004 – Process for District Medical Examiner Candidate Nomination to the Governor (attached) defines the process for finding suitable candidate(s) as Dr. Scheuerman's replacement that will be nominated by the Medical Examiners Commission and forwarded to the Governor for his consideration.

The Medical Examiners Commission staff will notify the Governor's Office of the anticipated vacancy, along with the Public Defender, Sheriff, Police Chiefs, County Commission, and funeral home directors for that medical examiner district, requesting that names of potential candidates for the position of district medical examiner be submitted to the Search Committee. In addition to those stakeholders, the Search Committee should also include a representative from the local medical community from within the bounds of that particular medical examiner district. I will serve as the physician member of the Medical Examiners Commission on this Search Committee, and you have agreed to Chair this Search Committee.

I look forward to working with you again on this matter.

11G-5.004 Process for District Medical Examiner Candidate Nomination to the Governor.

- (1) Policy Statement. Nominations for appointment as a district medical examiner shall be made only after solicitation of comments from city, county and state officials as well as from directors of funeral homes. Candidates nominated by the Medical Examiners Commission will be submitted to the Governor within 30 days after the Commission has voted on the matter. It is not the intent of the Commission to serve as the primary recruiting source for district medical examiner candidates, rather, the Commission intends that this responsibility should remain primarily within the district. The Commission will provide a medical examiner member of the Commission to participate in the candidate screening process at the district level.
 - (2) Procedure for Nomination for Reappointment of District Medical Examiners.
- (a) Prior to the expiration of each incumbent district medical examiner's three year term of appointment, the Medical Examiners Commission staff shall survey by written correspondence the district's state attorney(s), public defender(s), sheriff(s), police chief(s), county commissioner(s), funeral home directors and a member of the local medical community. The survey will solicit input from each relevant to performance of the incumbent district medical examiner and ask for a "favorable" or "non-favorable" response regarding nomination for reappointment. Additionally, the survey will ask for suggestions for improving district medical examiner services. The survey shall request recommendations for the nomination of the incumbent or any other qualified candidate(s) to serve as district medical examiner.
- (b) A summary of the survey results shall be provided to the Commission. Copies of the survey responses shall be forwarded to the incumbent district medical examiner by Commission staff. The incumbent, together with any other qualified candidates named in the survey responses, shall be notified in writing as to the date, time and place of the Commission meeting which will be considering the reappointment of the district medical examiner.
- (c) The Commission chairman may request establishment of a committee, as referred to in paragraph 11G-5.004(3)(b), F.A.C., to address concerns regarding the incumbent district medical examiner raised in the survey responses or to initiate a search for other candidates for nomination by the Commission.
 - (3) Procedure to fill a District Medical Examiner Vacancy.
- (a) The Governor will be notified by the Commission upon determination that a district medical examiner position has become vacant or is anticipated to become vacant. The Commission shall also notify the respective state attorney(s), public defender(s), sheriff(s), police chief(s), county commission(s) and funeral home directors for that medical examiner district, requesting that names of potential candidates for the position of district medical examiner be submitted to the candidate search committee established in paragarph 11G-5.004(3)(b), F.A.C.
- (b) Within 30 days of being notified of a vacancy or anticipated vacancy, the Chairman of the Commission shall call for a district candidate search committee to be established and appoint a chairman. The search committee shall consist of invited representatives from the offices of the state attorney(s), public defender(s), sheriff(s), police chief(s), county commission(s), funeral homes and a representative of the local medical community from within the bounds of that particular medical examiner district and a physician member of the Medical Examiners Commission or his designee. The search committee shall be requested to:
- 1. Seek applications from interested candidates who are licensed physicians and experienced practitioners of pathology who possess qualifications to take the examination or already possess the primary certification offered by the American Board of Pathology, American Osteopathic Board of Pathology, or equal qualification rendered by a non-United States medical specialty certifying agency.
- 2. Establish an interview team, which shall have a quorum of three participants, to interview interested candidates meeting minimum position qualifications. If the district includes a medical school, the dean of the medical school should be invited to participate as a member of the interview team.
- 3. Assure that the candidate(s) recommended to the Commission for nomination as district medical examiner is in agreement with the respective county representatives regarding the medical examiner budget as outlined in Section 406.06(3), F.S.
- 4. Review background information about the final candidate(s) from present and past sources, to include a criminal history check, comments of county medical associations, employment references, local hospitals, government agencies and funeral homes with which the candidate(s) has a prior working relationship. Background inquiries should incorporate information on work performance and working relationships, as well as the candidate(s) reasons for and circumstances of leaving employment.
- 5. Submit an interview package to the Medical Examiners Commission staff for each candidate recommended to the Commission for nomination consisting of: pertinent correspondence regarding the candidate(s); results of background inquiries; letters of reference; and a letter from the candidate(s) to the Commission staff authorizing the release of information from former

employers and the Board of Medicine in the state in which the candidate(s) is or was licensed.

- 6. Complete the candidate selection and interview process and submit interview packages to the Commission within 90 days of appointment of the candidate search committee unless additional time is requested in writing and approved by the Commission Chairman.
- (c) The Commission staff shall review interview packages for completeness, prior to their being submitted to the Medical Examiners Commission and, if directed by the Chairman, make additional inquiries concerning the candidate's background or qualification.
 - 1. The Commission staff shall verify each candidate's medical licensure status.
- 2. The Commission staff shall notify all candidates in writing of the time and place of the Commission meeting at which the district nomination(s) will be considered.
- (d) The Commission, by majority vote, shall nominate one or more candidates to the Governor, to fill a district medical examiner office vacancy prior to the expiration of six months from the date of the vacancy. Nothing herein is intended to restrict the Commission's consideration of candidates for nomination only to those persons who may be recommended by a candidate search committee.
- (e) The Commission will notify each candidate in writing as to the action taken by the Commission regarding their nomination as district medical examiner.
- (f) The Commission will notify the chairman of the candidate search committee in writing on action taken by the commission regarding candidates submitted by the district to fill a district medical examiner vacancy. If the Commission does not vote to nominate any of the candidates submitted by the candidate scarch committee, the chairman of the committee may be requested to submit other candidates. The Office of the Governor will be notified that none of the candidates submitted for that district were acceptable and that the position is still vacant.




