Background Checks/Costs

"General Public"

- Florida Check
- Fingerprints not required (name based search)
- \$24

Ex. Foreign visas, foreign adoption, 3rd party background check companies

"Applicant & Licensees"

- Florida/National Check
- Requires fingerprints (Biometric search of CCH, other states and national databases)
- \$21.25-37.25 (Florida cost varies per statute \$8-\$24 + \$13.25 federal fee)
- Authorized in Florida Statute/federal law

Ex. Daycare workers (DCF/\$21.25), CWP (DACS/\$28.25), school employees (districts/\$37.25)

"VECHS"

- Florida/National Check
- Requires fingerprints (Biometric search of other states and national databases)
- \$37.25 for Employees (\$24/\$13.25)
- \$29.25 for Volunteers (\$18/\$11.25)
- For those providing care to children, elderly or disabled

Ex. Private schools, youth programs, senior services
