**November 1, 2003-Pompano Beach**

A 4-year-old child was abducted and considered to be in extreme danger. A phone call was made to the Sheriff's Office the next day informing them on the whereabouts of the child after seeing the Amber alert on television.

## **Success Story**

**November 1, 2003-Cape Coral**

A 6 year old child was abducted and considered to be in danger. The recovery of the child the next morning was due to a truck driver recognizing the vehicle and the child at a convenience store, after hearing the Amber alert on the radio.

## **Success Story**

**July 7, 2003-Lake City**

A 10-year-old child was abducted and considered to be in extreme danger. The recovery of the child the next day was due to the Amber alert. A motel clerk in Georgia called in a tip after recognizing the mother and child from the Amber alert that was broadcast repeatedly in Florida, as well as, Georgia.

## **Success Story**

**June 30, 2003-Miramar**

Two young children were forcibly taken from their residence when the perpetrators drove a vehicle into the home and snatched both children after assaulting the caretaker. Although the Miramar Police Department located the children through several investigative means, the Amber alerts produced viable tips to include eye witness accounts of seeing the suspect earlier during the day of occurrence and later when the children were located.

## **Success Story**

**May 6, 2003-Jacksonville**

A 5 year old child was abducted by the mother's boyfriend following a violent argument. The suspect left the child with family members in another county. A phone call was made to the Sheriff's Office informing them on the whereabouts of the child after hearing the Amber alert.
