# NEW DIRECTOR OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE PROFESSIONALISM

Commissioner Glass is pleased to announce the promotion of Chad Brown to Director of Criminal Justice Professionalism (CJP). In his new role, Director Brown will oversee the overall responsibilities of Professionalism.

Director Brown has over 28 years of law enforcement experience. He started his law enforcement career with the Gainesville Police Department, where he served in various roles, including patrol operations and investigations. Director Brown began his FDLE career in

2007 as a Special Agent at the Gainesville Field Office, where he worked investigations involving major drug, economic crime, computer crime, public integrity, and violent crime. In January 2014, he was promoted to Inspector in the Office of Inspections, where he conducted agencywide reviews of investigative activity for compliance with FDLE policies and procedures. He was promoted to Special Agent Supervisor in the Office of Statewide Intelligence in August 2014, where he managed the Intelligence Watch and Warning Desk and served as the Director of the Florida Fusion Center.

In June 2015, Director Brown became the Resident Agent in Charge (RAC) of the Gainesville Field Office, managing FDLE's day-to-day investigative operations for five counties in North Central Florida. In February 2020, he was promoted to Assistant Special Agent in Charge (ASAC) in the Office of Statewide Investigative Services, overseeing the day-to-day operations of Florida's Sexual Offender and Career Offender Registries, and the Missing Endangered Persons Clearinghouse.

Director Brown holds a bachelor's degree in Administration of Criminal Justice and a master's degree in Strategic Leadership. He and his wife Karen have two sons, Avry and Owen.

# New Advanced Training: **ECONOMIC CRIME** Investigations

In August 2021, the Training Center Director's Association voted for Commission staff to develop a new course on economic crime investigations to replace the retired Advanced Course, #1154, Financial Fraud Investigations.

Commission staff worked with subject matter experts and practitioners to develop training that provides the following:

- more information on the types of economic crimes an investigator will likely encounter
- classroom activities and electives
- scenarios

On August 10, 2023, the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission approved the new 40hour Advanced Course, #1423, Economic Crime Investigations. Those who have completed, #1154, Financial Fraud Investigations are eligible to receive salary incentive or mandatory retraining credit for completing the new course.

In August 2021, the Training Center Director's Association and members with the Florida Association of Hostage Negotiators (FAHN) recommended that Commission staff examine the 40-hour Advanced Course, #093, Hostage Negotiation for outdated material and a possible revision.

Commission staff worked with members of FAHN and other subject matter experts (SMEs) to update the training and agreed that the course needed a complete overhaul to accurately reflect the current job description, duties, and best practices of a negotiator. Due to the extensive nature of the update, the SMEs agreed to also change the title of the course and retire the original version.

The new Advanced Course, #1424, Hostage and Crisis Negotiations, focuses more on barricaded subjects in crisis and less on hostage takers since most situations involving the deployment of a negotiation team involve the former. The training also provides more emphasis on the following:

- the history of negotiation
- subject motivators
- negotiation skills and risk assessment
- incident resolution
- in-class activities
- role-play scenarios

On August 10, 2023, the Criminal Justice Standards and Training

Commission retired Advanced Course, #093, Hostage Negotiation and approved the new Advanced Course, #1424, Hostage and Crisis Negotiations. Those who have completed Advanced Course, #093, Hostage Negotiation are eligible to receive salary incentive or mandatory retraining credit for completing the new course.

# Specialized Training: Recognize and Respond to Mental Health and Substance Abuse Emergencies

The 2021 Florida Legislature passed House Bill 7051, creating s. 943.1735, F.S. It directs the Commission to "establish standards for instruction of officers in the subject of Use of Force" for basic recruit training courses. In response, Commission staff reviewed current basic recruit courses and supplemented the 2022 materials as needed. Staff then sought input from agencies to determine whether there was a need for post-basic training on these same use of force subjects and found that there was.

Commission staff worked with members of the Florida Crisis Intervention Team coalition to develop a one-day training to teach current law enforcement officers how to:

- recognize the common symptoms and characteristics of an individual with a substance abuse disorder or a mental illness
- appropriately respond to such symptoms and characteristics

On August 10, 2023, the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission approved the new 8-hour Specialized Course, #1421, Recognize and Respond to Mental Health and Substance Abuse Emergencies.



#### EXECUTIVE LEADERSHIP SEMINAR CLASS 10 GRADUATION



The Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute announces the graduation of the Executive Leadership Seminar Class 10 on September 22, 2023 at the Valencia College School of Public Safety. The 22 class participants met over three sessions to engage in training on topics such as the heart of leadership, building and maintaining community trust, character-driven policing, and dealing with a multi-generational workforce. The Executive Leadership Seminar is an educational opportunity for the upper management leadership of Florida criminal justice organizations.

The Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute, established within the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and affiliated with the state university system, was established in 1990 by the Florida Legislature to address the need for an innovative and multi-faceted approach to the education and training of criminal justice professionals.



# THE 2ND COORDINATOR'S CONFERENCE WAS A HUGE SUCCESS

During the second annual Coordinator's Workshop, hosted at Polk State College, 46 coordinators from around the state trained in a variety of different topics. For two and a half days, the coordinators received specialized instruction on best practices for reality-based training, test bank creation and test integrity, discipline, CJSTC trust fund and training school audits, and instructor retention and recruiting strategies. They watched a live training center audit take place and also conducted tabletop exercises to share their organizational processes with each other. Finally, they participated in a question and answer session where participants were able to ask a panel of directors critical questions about their jobs. Directors Bond, Morton, and Samuelson discussed everything from funding to incentivizing recruitment.

Perhaps most valuable to them were the networking opportunities. On day one, coordinators interacted over a catered lunch from Mission BBQ and enjoyed a meet-and-greet event at Margaritaville. At the end of the workshop, coordinators completed surveys and received their certificate from the Training Center Directors Association. Special thank you to Director Jay Romine, Michelle Sparks-Raymond, Director Vince Morton, Dr. Richard Wright, and Lisa Correll for the time they volunteered to instruct. Their skillful instruction was essential to the workshop's success.
