The Florida Corrections Accreditation Commission, Inc. (FCAC) and the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation, Inc. (CFA) held their meetings on June 18-19, 2025. The FCAC reaccredited one agency with Excelsior reaccreditation, a status that is awarded after five successful reaccreditations without conditions. Three agencies received their FCAC reaccreditation. One agency received their initial accreditation from the CFA, 16 were reaccredited with Excelsior status, and 12 received reaccreditation.

New Alzheimer’s Disease and Related Dementias Training for Criminal Justice Officers

In 2024, House Bill 801 required Commission staff to work with the Florida Department of Elder Affairs to develop a continued-employment online training that provides instruction on techniques for recognizing behavioral symptoms and characteristics, effective communication, employing the use of alternatives to physical restraints, and identifying signs of abuse, neglect or exploitation.



Professionalism Works With Partners to Develop Training Videos

To enhance learner engagement, Commission staff developed a series of short instructional videos on how to recognize and respond to those living with Alzheimer’s disease and related dementias (ADRD). Post-Basic Curriculum members Haley Greb, Travis Cole and Mary Clare Swanson paved the way by developing scripts and directing the sets for four different videos to be embedded into the training.

Around a month before they were scheduled to film, Haley, Travis and Mary Clare worked closely with FDLE videographer Eric Bouquio to scout out filming locations and conduct walkthroughs. They coordinated with the Leon County Sheriff’s Office to acquire officers and jail space, worked with Theatre Tallahassee and even members of their own division to play various roles. Members with the Florida Department of Elder Affairs and the Alzheimer’s Association were on-set to ensure the actors were accurately portraying those with ADRD.

Members, actors and SMEs faced challenges along with way, like having to navigate major back-to-back hurricanes that nearly derailed the filming project. Rob Bates, who manages the Post-Basic Curriculum section, commended everyone for how they handled the adversity. “Haley, Travis, Mary Clare, Eric and our stakeholders continued to stay flexible in the face of uncertainty and found a way to reschedule one of the shoots to a later date. They know how much this training means to the public.”

The videos depict ADRD-related calls that officers are most likely to encounter. For example, one is about an elderly woman who wanders away from home while another depicts an elderly man who is pulled over for driving dangerously. A third video takes place in a jail, where officers use communication strategies to calm down an elderly inmate in distress. An actor shortage prevented the team from filming a fourth scenario that focused on de-escalation techniques.

Members like Travis Cole emphasized the importance of good preparation. “The prep work done by the team was the most important aspect of this entire process,” said Cole. “Without solid prep ahead of time, we would not have been able to write scripts or even film the scenes.”

New Lethality Assessment Training for Law Enforcement Officers



Police Training

Training Deadline: 10/01/2026

Senate Bill 1224 amended s. 741.29, F.S., to require all law enforcement officers to complete a mandatory one-time training on adopted statewide policies and procedures for administering a lethality assessment during a domestic violence call that involves an intimate partnership.

This one-hour online training is not meant to teach law enforcement officers how to handle domestic violence calls; instead, it explains what a lethality assessment is, when and how to administer it during a domestic violence call, the process for advising the victim of the nearest locally certified domestic violence center and what to include in the police report and filing packet.

Online Course and Form Effective Dates

On May 15, 2025, the CJSTC approved the hour-long course which may count toward an officer's mandatory retraining requirement. The online course became available Tuesday, July 1, 2025. Officers may access the new course through FDLE's Online

It is important to note that a law enforcement officer may not administer this lethality assessment to a victim if the officer has not completed the online training required to administer it.

Deadline to Complete the Training

Those who complete the Florida Basic Recruit Training Program: Law Enforcement (Version 2026.07) beginning on or after July 1, 2026, will automatically meet this training requirement. All other law enforcement officers have until October 1, 2026, to complete the online training to maintain their certification.

Training Requirement Verification

By November 1, 2026, the head of each law enforcement agency shall provide written certification to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement verifying that the law enforcement agency has complied with the training requirements. NEW PATROL RIFLE AND SHOTGUN COURSES

During the 2023 firearms rewrite, the subject matter expert (SME) workgroup removed semi-automatic rifle/carbine and shotgun content from the basic recruit training (BRT) program's Criminal Justice Firearms 80-hour course to allow for more in-depth pistol instruction. The SMEs also noted that the previous version of the Firearms Instructor Course did not provide instruction on how to teach patrol rifle or shotgun skills.

To address this training gap, Commission staff worked with SMEs to develop optional patrol rifle and shotgun courses to teach officers how to safely handle and operate the weapon system as well as to provide instructors the resources to learn how to teach long gun skills to officers.

- 32-hour Specialized Instructor Course, #3024, Patrol Rifle Instructor
- 24-hour Specialized Instructor Course, #3025, Shotgun Instructor
- 32-hour Specialized Course, #3026, Patrol Rifle Operator
- 24-hour Specialized Course, #3027, Shotgun Operator

Instructor Courses

Both long gun instructor courses contain general firearms instructor techniques found in the Specialized Instructor Course, #801, Handgun Instructor. The new instructor courses review the operator course curriculum and teach instructor-students how to evaluate and remediate students on proficiency evaluations and qualifications.

To successfully complete either long gun instructor course, instructor-students must pass, without remediation, a series of proficiency evaluations and qualifications similar to those found in the handgun instructor course. Only Commission-certified handgun instructors are eligible to take the long gun instructor courses, and successful completion of the patrol rifle or shotgun instructor course will lead to Commission-certification in that weapon system. Additionally, only instructor-students who become Commission-certified patrol rifle or shotgun instructors will be authorized to teach the respective long gun instructor and operator course. They will also be authorized to sign off on mandatory in-service rifle or shotgun qualifications biennially, beginning July 1, 2026.

Important: Long gun instructor-students will not be required to complete an additional high-liability internship to earn the certification; handgun instructors will not be required to become long gun instructors; officers will not be required to take the operator courses.



Shotgun Courses Continues

Firearms Instructor to be Renamed to Handgun Instructor

The current firearms instructor courses only provide instruction on how to teach handguns. Therefore, effective July 1, 2025, the courses will be renamed from "Firearms Instructor Course" to "Handgun Instructor Course."

The Criminal Justice Firearms course in the basic recruit training (BRT) program will keep its current title since instructors who teach the 80-hour block have the option to familiarize students with the patrol rifle or shotgun if time permits.

Instructors Train-the-Trainer

Once all four long gun courses go into effect July 1, 2025, the SMEs will coordinate with and visit various regions of the state to train and certify only current handgun instructors who are assigned to training centers. Then, it will be up to those newly certified long gun instructors to train other handgun instructors in their regions.

Training centers will be responsible for coordinating their own classes once their handgun instructors have



been certified to teach the long gun courses.

CJSTC Forms Renamed

Beginning July 1, 2025, the form CJSTC-4H Handgun Instructor Performance Evaluation will replace the form CJSTC-4I Firearms Instructor Performance Evaluation. Additionally, the form CJSTC-4 Handgun Performance Evaluation will replace the previous version of the same form, CJSTC-4 Firearms Performance Evaluation. Only the titles to the forms will change; everything else will remain the same.

New CJSTC Instructor Forms

Long gun instructors will be required to use the following forms when evaluating patrol rifle or shotgun instructor-students who seek a long gun certification:

- CJSTC-4R Patrol Rifle Instructor Performance Evaluation
- CJSTC-4S Shotgun Instructor Performance Evaluation

Unlike the instructor courses, the operator courses will not have official CJSTC forms since they do not involve a certification. Instead, they will contain sample evaluation forms for instructors to use as they evaluate and qualify operator course students.

Operator Courses

Both long gun operator courses expand on the material used in the 2023 BRT Criminal Justice Firearms 80-hour course with more information on shooting stances and ready positions as well as new content on mechanical offset, movement positions and shooting from behind cover. Additionally, the Patrol Rifle Operator course will teach and require students to demonstrate how to transition from rifle to pistol during a deadly force encounter.

To successfully complete either long gun operator course, students must pass a series of proficiency evaluations and qualifications similar to those in the academy. Additionally, the Patrol Rifle Operator course will require students to complete active threat/shooter drills.

These optional courses are designed to familiarize students with the weapon systems, not to provide a

certification. They may also be used to prepare officers for the biennial long gun qualifications.

Biennial Long Gun Qualifications in 2026

Beginning July 1, 2026, any law enforcement officer who carries or operates a patrol rifle or shotgun while on duty will need to qualify with them as they would a handgun. Only Commission-certified long gun instructors, or Commission-certified handgun instructors who complete any long gun instructor-style training recognized by their agency, will be authorized to sign off on those respective long gun qualifications.

The patrol rifle qualification will be a 31-round course of fire (30 for rifle and one for pistol), and the shotgun qualification will be a six-round course of fire (either slugs, eight-pellet shot, or nine-pellet shot). Both qualifications are defined in their respective long gun operator and instructor courses.

Similar to the in-service handgun qualification held biennially, law enforcement agencies will dictate the number of attempts their officers will have to qualify with their long gun(s).

More information about the long gun qualifications and the associated revision of form CJSTC-86A will be released in a technical memorandum closer to the 2026 effective date.

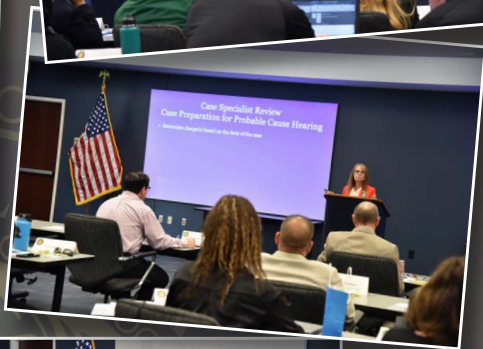


2025 Training Center Directors Workshop

The 26th Training Center Directors Workshop was held at the Florida Department of Law Enforcement from April 29, 2025, through May 2, 2025. A total of 21 people, including six directors, attended the full workshop with others coming in for specific topic areas. The workshop provided a valuable opportunity for new directors to network and to learn some best practices. The attendees received 28 hours of training that may be used towards their instructor retraining requirements.

The workshop was started in 2002 to provide new training center directors and their staff with training on the rules and requirements related to training center certification, staffing and facilities along with information about officer training, instructor certification and requirements related to the Standards and Training Trust Fund. To date, a total of 529 directors, coordinators and fiscal agents have attended a workshop. Over the years, the workshop has evolved based on feedback from the participants to provide the most current and relevant information possible.

The planning for the 27th Training Center Directors Workshop in 2026 will begin soon. Be on the lookout for further information.
