## Potential Indicators of Suspicious Activities Related To Rental Trucks

### What Should I Consider Suspicious?

- Reluctance to provide required personal information when completing rental paperwork
- Inability to recall the name being used to rent a vehicle
- Surveilling the facility or expressing interest in activities beyond mere casual or professional interest such that a reasonable person would consider the activity suspicious
- Irregular rental patterns, which may include renting large box-style trucks for several short periods over successive weeks or renting successively larger
- Asking inquiries from potential rental truck operators, which may include:
  - Carriage height,
  - Ability to drive up and over curbs,
  - Rate of acceleration,
  - Durability in a front-end collision,
  - Whether fenders and hoods are plastic or metal, and
  - Drivability after air bag deployment

*It is important to remember that just because someone's speech, actions, beliefs, appearance, or way of life is different, does not mean that he or she is suspicious.*

### What Should I Do?

- ✓ Require a valid driver's license from all customers.
- ✓ Make note of suspicious statements, people and/or vehicles.
- ✓ Report missing or stolen vehicles or license plates to law enforcement authorities.
- ✓ If something seems wrong, notify law enforcement authorities.
