# **Success Story**

#### April 2013 - Hillsborough County

Two siblings were allegedly abducted by their non-custodial parents. After seeing the AMBER Alert on television a citizen notified law enforcement of a vehicle the citizen sold to the suspects. This information allowed the investigation to shift its focus and the children were safely recovered in an out of country location

## **Success Story**

### October 2013 - Lee County

A child was allegedly abducted by her non-custodial mother. There was a history of abuse of the child by the mother. Members of the Department of Agriculture are notified as part of the AMBER Alert process. Department of Agriculture personnel sighted the vehicle the mother had used in the abduction and subsequently performed a traffic stop. The child was recovered safely.

## **Success Story**

#### December 2013 - Duval County

A child was allegedly abducted by her non-custodial mother. There were indications the mother was an endangerment to the child. After investigative efforts determined the mother and child were in Georgia the Florida AMBER Alert was extended to Georgia. Local law enforcement in Georgia performed a traffic stop after receiving information on the subjects and the vehicle. The child was recovered safely.
