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Letter from D.A.R.E Coordinator

On behalf of the Florida Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) Program, I am pleased to announce that 2022 was another amazing year. I am frequently asked if D.A.R.E. is still around and if D.A.R.E. really works. The answer remains a definite "Yes!". The D.A.R.E. program is growing with educational programs on subjects including opioid abuse prevention, vaping and teen suicide. Because of the partnering with educational institutions to adapt the curricula, D.A.R.E. has enhanced lessons which include bullying, cyber security, a supplemental marijuana lesson, family talks, mental health, celebration of life lessons and the recently launched K-12 Opioid Prescription Drug Abuse Prevention lessons.

With the D.A.R.E. curriculum constantly being updated to address current issues facing our children, it is important that the school resource officers stay well-trained on the updates. We conducted our 86th and 87th Florida D.A.R.E. Officer Training (DOT) salary incentive certification classes this year at the Hilton Orlando in Altamonte Springs, Florida and the B Ocean Resort Conference Center in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, respectively.

This year's training conferences had 55 graduating students from the following 28 agencies: Anderson County (KY) Sheriff's Office (SO), Bay Harbor Islands Police Department (PD), Bunnell PD, Clermont PD, Coconut Creek PD, Doral PD, Fort Myers PD, Gadsden County SO, Green Cove Springs PD, Hamilton County SO, Hendry County SO, Hialeah Gardens PD, Jackson County SO, Lake County SO, Lowndes County (GA) SO, Macon County (NC) SO, Madison County SO, Margate PD, Marion County SO, Miami Beach PD, Miami-Dade PD, Orange Park PD, Ormond Beach PD, Rocky Mount (NC) PD, Senoia (GA) PD, Volusia County SO, Washington County SO, and West Miami PD.

This year's training team was facilitated by Corporal Ken Vila (Collier County SO), Annette Castor (Osceola Elementary School, Collier County), Lieutenant Anglie Hightower-Holmes (Gadsden County SO), Deputy Terry Allen (Retired, Lake County SO), Lieutenant Fred Jones (Lake County SO), and Corporal Rochelle Mims (Marion County SO).

As we enter 2023, we are preparing for our next DOT classes this summer in Fort Lauderdale and Ocala, Florida.

Thank you for your ongoing commitment to providing D.A.R.E. training to Florida's youth. This is very much a team effort and we commend you for your exemplary efforts.

D.A.R.E. Program Overview

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) has been actively involved with the D.A.R.E. program since 1988. It is a statewide diversion and prevention program for drug abuse in juveniles that is administered throughout Florida's schools. The primary role and responsibility of FDLE in the D.A.R.E. program is to serve as the state training coordinator and program administrator. This administration includes preparation and oversight of the budget, training, and certification of officers and preparation of the annual D.A.R.E. report. Additionally, FDLE is responsible for ensuring compliance with national standards, delivery of technical assistance and providing statewide program management.

The D.A.R.E. program was developed and implemented in California in 1983 through the combined efforts of the Los Angeles Police Department and the Los Angeles Unified School District. The initial 17-week curriculum was designed to provide awareness and facts to elementary school students with the intent that this knowledge would help them resist peer pressure to experiment with alcohol and other drugs. Gang and violence prevention strategies were included in that curriculum to provide a more solid foundation for our children. The evaluations of the curriculum for students in grades 6 through 9 show students completing the course experienced the following:

- 32-44% reduction in marijuana, tobacco, and alcohol use
- 29-34% decrease in intent to accept substances
- Reduction and cessation in substance use among those already using

Although the program has undergone revisions over its 39 years, D.A.R.E. continues to be a law enforcement officer-led series of classroom lessons that teaches children from kindergarten through high school how to make good decisions and wise choices. The curricula cover a wide range of risks that children face daily, including drug use, and encourage them to lead a positive lifestyle. Today, D.A.R.E. is in over 70% of school districts nationally, has been implemented in more than 50 countries, and, according to the U.S. Department of Justice, "the D.A.R.E. program offers students the opportunity to gain a trustworthy adult friend, develop a positive attitude toward law enforcement personnel and acquire greater respect for the law."








D.A.R.E. classes #86 and #87 were successful 80-hour salary incentive officer training classes stressing the D.A.R.E. mission of "teaching students good decision-making skills to help them lead safe and healthy lives". Its purpose is to fulfill a vision of "a world in which students everywhere are empowered to respect others and choose to lead lives free from violence, substance use and other dangerous behaviors".

Only officers who are carefully vetted by leadership in their community law enforcement agencies are sent to DOT. They are further vetted by the mentors responsible for training new D.A.R.E. officers. Then, D.A.R.E. officers undergo the rigorous training course conducted by mentors with a significant number of years of classroom experience as well as university-level educators. All officers are taught to deliver the curricula exactly as they are written, thereby achieving the goal of nearly 100 percent implementation fidelity. Over and above the 80-hours of course instruction, officers also undergo additional hours of practicing the lessons in small groups and in front of the entire group. Throughout the course, officers are assessed for readiness to deliver the curricula.
