Commission Elects Chair, Vice Chair

At its August meeting in Ponte Vedra, FL, the Commission elected *Director Greg Hutching* to serve as chairman and *Warden Edward L. Griffin* as vice chair. Section 943.11, Florida Statutes, requires the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission to elect a chair and other officers annually.



Chairman Hutching replaces former Commission member Sheriff Susan Benton, who served as chair over the previous year. Chairman Hutching began his tenure with the Commission on August 1, 2012, as the representative for the state's criminal justice training schools. For the past seven years he has directed the Florida Panhandle Technical College Public Safety Institute in Chipley, Florida. He brings with him years of experience serving as a corrections officer and inspector with the Florida Department of Corrections. Chairman Hutching also has experience as a deputy at the Bay County Sheriff's Office and the Washington County Sheriff's Office.



Vice Chair Griffin replaces Greg Hutching, who served as vice chair from January 2013 until the time of this recent election. Vice Chair Griffin began his tenure with the Commission on August 2, 2011, fulfilling the designated position of administrator of a state correctional institution. He brings with him over 29 years of experience, having progressed through the ranks to serve as warden at Avon Park Correctional Institution, Marion Correctional Institution, Wakulla Correctional Institution, and, currently, Putnam Correctional Institution.

New Property Repossession Course Now Available Online



DLE has debuted its Property Repossession Processes course in a new online format. The course is designed to help officers better understand how property repossession works. It covers such important topics as breach of the peace and a repossession agent's rights.

This course is in an entirely different format from previous courses designed by FDLE's Professionalism Division. While it has a traditional appearance, it implements best practices for online instruction. The course focuses on what is relevant to the student and considers how he or she will use the training in the real world. Throughout the training the student is continuously learning and totally engaged in the learning process.

Officers and telecommunicators may take this course at their convenience free of charge. It takes approximately 45 minutes to one hour to complete the course. The Commission has approved a two-hour credit for completion of this course. Pending agency head approval, completion of this course can be credited towards an officer's mandatory retraining requirements.

FDLE Launches Unidentified Persons Reporting Course

In 2005, a joint initiative began at FDLE between the Missing and Endangered Persons Information Clearinghouse (MEPIC) and the Florida Medical Examiners Commission to gather resources and pinpoint methods to help identify the deceased. The purpose of this initiative was to bring renewed attention to the growing number of unidentified persons in Florida. MEPIC, with support from the Professionalism Division's Bureau of Professional Development, has created a distance learning course that defines the responsibilities of law enforcement and district medical examiners when working an unidentified person case. The course, Unidentified Persons Reporting, provides the following training:

- Provides instructions on filling out the Unidentified Person Report form;
- Gives step-by-step instructions on entering a case into the Florida Crime Information Center/National Crime Information Center (FCIC/NCIC) database;
- Discusses information on the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System (NamUs) database; and
- Shows the importance of cooperation between and among agencies working unidentified persons cases.

Certified officers may be awarded one hour of training that can be applied toward the 40-hour mandatory retraining requirement with their agency head's approval. A certificate of completion is provided at the end of the course. The certificate can be turned in to the person designated by your agency to enter records in the Automated Training Management System (ATMS).



MANDATORY RETRAINING FOR 2015

By June 30, 2015, 18,812 officers are required to complete mandatory retraining. As of September 2, 2014, 4,735 officers (25 percent) have met the required training for Fiscal Year 2014–2015.

Officers who do not complete the required mandatory retraining on or before June 30, 2015, are not eligible to perform the duties of a criminal justice officer until the requirements are met. Any officer who fails to complete the required mandatory retraining by the deadline will be separated in ATMS effective July 1, 2015.

SECURITY REQUIREMENTS

In keeping with FDLE's policy on maintaining the integrity of the ATMS database, the following security procedures are in force:

- Passwords are to be changed every 90 days and must have at least 8 characters, with at least one capital letter, some lower case letters and a number.
- If the ATMS user does not access the database within 90 days, the system will automatically disable the user. The user may contact the agency's Criminal Justice Customer Service Specialist for assistance by calling 850-410-8600.



FIREARMS MANDATORY TRAINING FOR 2016

All officers who hold an active law enforcement certification are required to qualify on the Commission-approved 40-round course of fire at least once every two years, with the results documented on Form CJSTC-86A. The 2014-2016 cycle of qualifications is due by June 30, 2016. A total of 50,276 officers are required to complete firearms mandatory retraining by June 30, 2016. As of September 2, 2014, the number of officers who have completed the required training for the 2014-2016 cycle is 3,078.

Officers who do not complete the required firearms mandatory retraining on or before June 30, 2016, are ineligible to perform the duties of a criminal justice officer until the requirement is met. Any officer who does not complete the required training by the deadline will be separated in ATMS effective July 1, 2016.

Florida Leadership Academy Graduates Thirty-Four Criminal Justice Leaders

he Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute announced the graduation of 34 first-line supervisors from the Florida Leadership Academy on August 8, 2014. The graduates serve in leadership roles within criminal justice agencies throughout the state.

Seminar participants met for four weeks at the Broward College Institute of Public Safety in Davie, Florida. Graduates learned skills necessary to support the needs of their agencies and their communities in preparation for future challenges.

The goal of the Florida Leadership Academy is to prepare first-line supervisors in criminal justice organizations to exemplify the character and integrity expected of criminal justice professionals, while examining the various components necessary to become efficient leaders.

The Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute, established within the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and affiliated with the State University System, was established in 1990 by the Florida Legislature to address the need for an innovative and multi-faceted approach to the education and training of criminal justice professionals.
