### Commission Re-elects Chair, Vice Chair

Section 943.11, Florida Statutes, requires the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission to elect a chair and other officers annually. At its May meeting in Naples, Fla., the Commission reelected **Chairman Ernie George** and **Vice-Chairman Ric Bradshaw** to serve a third consecutive term in those positions. Both were reelected without opposition and by unanimous vote.

Chairman George was appointed to serve a partial term on the Commission as a Florida resident on January 6, 2006, and was reappointed for a full term in August 2009. This was his second appointment to the Commission; Mr. George served previously, from May 2001 to August 2005 while a sergeant with the West Palm Beach Police Department. From May 2007 to his appointment as chair in May 2010, he was the Commission's vice-chair.



Vice-Chairman Ric Bradshaw has been a member of the Commission since August 25, 2008; his first term as a commissioner expires on August 1, 2012. He was first elected to serve a one-year term as vice-chair in October 2010, and was re-elected in 2011. Vice-Chairman Bradshaw is the elected sheriff of Palm Beach County.

The next meeting of the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission will be held on August 9th in Ponte Vedra, Florida.

The Florida Medical Examiners Commission (MEC) is housed within and supported by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement. In addition to being the **Bureau Chief of Standards, Glen Hopkins** also served as staff director for the MEC from November 2009 to March 2012. A resolution presented to Mr. Hopkins by the MEC praised his leadership and dedication, as well as his insightful and thorough oversight of investigations. **Planning and Policy Administrator Margaret Edwards** was named to succeed Mr. Hopkins as staff director for the MEC.

FDLE **Assistant General Counsel R. Craig Rockenstein**, who joined FDLE's Office of General Counsel in 1986 and has served as legal advisor to the MEC for most of that time, retired from FDLE on May 31st. Mr. Rockenstein was recognized and commended for his years of enriching and enthusiastic service to the MEC on May 25th at a meeting of the Commission in Ocala, Fla. Succeeding him as staff attorney for the MEC is FDLE **Assistant General Counsel Jim Martin**.

## *Commission Approves 2012 Basic Recruit Training Programs*

**O**n May 10, 2012, the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission approved new versions of all basic recruit training programs. These updated versions of the curricula ensure that Florida officers will receive current training for their profession. The basic recruit training programs include the full Law Enforcement, Corrections, and Correctional Probation, as well as multiple cross-over programs and one auxiliary program. Previous versions were retired as indicated below. The following information is also available in Technical Memorandum 2012-10, distributed on June 4, 2012.

### *Law Enforcement*

The following programs were reviewed for all appropriate legislative, case law, and other necessary revisions as required annually for each new version.

- Florida CMS Law Enforcement Basic Recruit Training Program, 770 hours, ATMS #1177—Version 2012.07 UPDATED effective July 1, 2012
- CMS Law Enforcement Auxiliary Officer Basic Recruit Training Program, 319 hours, ATMS #1180—Version 2012.07 UPDATED effective July 1, 2012

### *Correctional Probation*

This program was also reviewed for appropriate legislative, case law, and other necessary revisions as required annually for each new version. Additionally, the 16-hour firearms familiarity course was removed, thus reducing the total program hours. With this change, any correctional probation officer approved by the Florida Department of Corrections to carry a firearm on the job must first complete the Commission's 80-hour basic recruit training program course at a Commission-certified training school.

- Florida Correctional Probation Basic Recruit Training Program, 449 hours, ATMS #1176—Version 2012.07 UPDATED effective July 1, 2012

### *Corrections*

After a thorough development process, the new Florida CMS Correctional Basic Recruit Training Program was approved and is ready for implementation as planned on July 1, 2012. Positive feedback from the field test, which has been underway since October 2011, indicates the curriculum is effective in preparing recruits for the job. Additionally, field test students have performed well on the state officer certification exams with an average pass rate of 86 percent on the first attempt. Please note that the Correctional Auxiliary Basic Recruit Training Program has been retired by the Commission due to lack of use. As of July 1, 2012, an individual desiring certification as a Correctional Auxiliary Officer must complete the full Florida CMS Correctional Basic Recruit Training Program.

### *Cross-Overs*

In response to the extensive rewrite of the new correctional curriculum, all cross-over programs were thoroughly evaluated in preparation for their 2012 versions. After a detailed review of the basic recruit curriculum, three new courses were developed for inclusion in the cross-over programs. The following two courses were added to every cross-over basic recruit training program:

### ***2012 Basic Recruit Training Programs***

- Cross-Over Program Updates CJK\_0393 (8 hours) –This course allows schools to provide expanded instruction and updates on specific topics included in the full basic recruit program.
- Cross-Over to Officer Wellness –This course provides instruction to enhance job performance and may or may not include physical exercise. The two physical fitness assessments required in Rule 11B-35.001(15), F.A.C. and Form CJSTC-67A are not required for the Cross-over BRTPs. The course number and hours for each course vary based on the total number of hours for the training program.

In addition, a Cross-Over Handgun Transition Course (24 hours) has been added to two cross-over programs: Law Enforcement Officer Cross-Over to Florida CMS Correctional Basic Recruit Training Program #1192 and Correctional Officer Cross-Over to Florida CMS Law Enforcement Basic Recruit Training Program #1191. This additional training provides a basic refresher firearms course and helps ensure that officers are proficient with the handgun used in the new discipline. Students must demonstrate both daylight and nighttime proficiency with a handgun based on the course of fire used in the basic recruit training.

## *New Specialized Courses Approved*

At its May meeting, the Commission approved two new post-basic courses: Specialized Course 1194, Responding to Veterans, effective May 10, 2012; and Specialized Course 1195, Public Service Telecommunications for Law Enforcement Officers, effective July 1, 2012.

### *Responding to Veterans*

With the increasing numbers of troops returning from combat zones, criminal justice officers are encountering military personnel with both the visible and invisible wounds of war. The 16-hour Responding to Veterans course is designed to help officers understand the unique issues facing veterans. Officers will learn to recognize the unpredictable behavior associated with combat post-traumatic stress disorder and traumatic brain injury, learn how to gain rapport with veterans, and develop enhanced skills for de-escalating potentially volatile situations and working toward a successful resolution. Actual combat videos provide an understanding of the veteran's war experiences. Other videos show real encounters between officers and military personnel in distress and how the situations were defused.

### *Public Service Telecommunications for Law Enforcement Officers*

In 2010, the Florida Legislature passed a bill requiring law enforcement officers with temporary duties in telecommunications to complete a 232-hour public safety telecommunications training program and pass a state-administered examination by October 1, 2012. This bill provides an exemption from completing the training prior to taking the state examination. However, a law enforcement officer who fails the exam must complete a 40-hour public safety telecommunication training program sponsored by the Department of Law Enforcement before retaking the exam. Four of the five lessons in the 40-hour course will be available to officers online through the Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute at FDLE. Students will receive 17 hours of credit for completion of this portion of the training. Students will be required to complete a 3 hour National Incident Management Course offered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and 20 hours of hands-on training in a telecommunications center or simulated setting.



Procedures for administering the training program are being announced through a technical memorandum with full implementation beginning July 1, 2012.

## *Two Advanced Courses Revised*

The Bureau of Training, Curriculum Development Section has updated two advanced courses that were approved by the Commission in February 2012. The revised courses became effective on April 1, 2012.

- Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Investigations, Advanced Course 016 (40 hours), was updated with legislative revisions, the latest drug crime trends, and effective investigative techniques. The course provides an understanding of the problematic, legal, investigative, and evidentiary aspects of narcotic and dangerous drug investigations and how they relate to money laundering. Students have opportunities to apply concepts and skills through the use of scenarios, case studies, and role-play exercises.
- Substance Abuse Awareness and Education, Advanced Course 074 (40 hours), teaches the knowledge, skills, and attitudes that will enable law enforcement, corrections, and correctional probation officers to become more aware of the substance abuse problems currently facing our state. The course identifies relevant legal issues, discusses the effects of substance abuse on society, and provides a list of resources and referral methods. Students also gain experience preparing a written outline and presenting a substance abuse presentation.

## *State Officer Certification Examination Statistics Third Quarter, FY 2011-12*

**A**t each quarterly meeting of the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission, results for the State Officer Certification Examination (SOCE) are reported as part of the informational agenda. During this time period, students from North Florida Community College, Florida Gateway College, Lake Technical Center and St. Johns River Community College achieved a 100% pass rate on the Law Enforcement SOCE on their first attempt.

On the Corrections SOCE, Brevard Community College, Chipola College, Florida Gateway College, Valencia College and Manatee Sheriff's Office Training Center achieved a 100% pass rate for students taking the SOCE for the first time.

### *SOCE Monthly School Reports*

Training schools may access the SOCE results for their students via ATMS. The report contains the name, examination information, type of training completed and results for each student from that school for the selected time frame. To run the report after logging in to ATMS, select the **Administration** button from the choices on the left side of the screen. Then select **Reports** and scroll down to **Training Center Reports**. The report is titled **Student Results by School**.

## *D.A.R.E. Florida Certifies Twelve Officers*

On March 30, 2012 in Tavares, Florida, the Florida D.A.R.E. Training Center certified eleven new police officers and deputy sheriffs from all over the State of Florida, along with two officers from the U.S. Navy base in Guantanamo, Cuba, to teach the D.A.R.E. curriculum in their respective jurisdictions. The program consisted of 80 hours of intensive training in classroom instruction and management, along with perfecting the D.A.R.E. elementary and middle school curriculum that is currently being taught to children all over the world. The students were required to demonstrate their proficiency in the training by teaching an assigned 45-minute lesson to their peers with a mentor giving the final grade. The students were then required to deliver lessons in a local elementary school to demonstrate their confidence in teaching children in their school setting. Participants were given a final written exam prior to graduating from this program.

## Twenty-Three Managers Graduate from CES



The Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute announced the graduation of 23 senior managers from the Chief Executive Seminar on May 16, 2012 at the Florida Department of Law Enforcement Headquarters. ## *FDLE Holds Inaugural Advanced Leadership Program*

The first session of the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE), Advanced Leadership Program (ALP) was held in February, 2012. This newly developed in-class training consisted of three week-long sessions. On May 25, 2012, the ALP graduated 30 FDLE members from this charter class.

This program was designed to identify and develop current members with the potential to fill key leadership positions within FDLE. It will increase the availability of experienced and capable personnel who are prepared to assume leadership roles as positions become available. Topics included: an overall introduction of leadership principles, a discussion of emerging trends, leadership of teams, ethics, risk management and managing multiple generations. Group discussions and exercises allowed participants to learn from each other as well as instructors. Participants were assigned group and individual projects that were presented to members of FDLE's Executive Policy Board.

### SECURITY REQUIREMENTS

In keeping with FDLE’s policy on maintaining the integrity of the ATMS database, the following security procedures have been implemented. Passwords are to be changed every 90 days and must have at least 8 characters, with at least one capital letter, some lower case letters and a number. If the ATMS user does not access the database within 90 days, the system will automatically disable the user. The user may contact the agency’s Criminal Justice Customer Service Specialist for assistance by calling 850-410-8600.



### MANDATORY RETRAINING FOR 2012

19,111 officers are required to complete mandatory retraining by June 30, 2012. As of June 22, 2012, 420 officers (about 2 percent) have not met the required training for Fiscal Year 2011-2012.



*Officers who do not complete the required mandatory retraining on or before June 30, 2012 will be ineligible to perform the duties of a criminal justice officer until the requirements are met. The officer will be separated in ATMS effective July 1, 2012.*
