SUBJECT: Repeal of the Role Play Practicum Check Sheet, Form CJSTC-3

Since 2008 when role-play scenarios were first introduced in the Florida CMS Law Enforcement Basic Recruit Training Program, training schools have been required to complete the Role Play Practicum Check Sheet, Form CJSTC-3, to ensure the required scenarios were performed in the basic recruit training academy.

The new Florida CMS Correctional Basic Recruit Training Program, which became effective July 1, 2012, also contains numerous role-play scenarios throughout the program to provide simulated on-the-job training.

In an effort to streamline record keeping, the Commission repealed Form CJSTC-3 during the promulgation of new rules, effective May 21, 2012. The role-play scenarios in the law enforcement and correctional basic recruit training programs are still mandatory; however, Form CJSTC-3 is no longer required for the course file.
