## ***Farewell To** / **Warden Edward L. Griffin***



After over 34 years of devoted service to the Florida Department of Corrections, Warden Edward L. Griffin will retire on December 12, 2019. Warden Griffin began his criminal justice career with the Department on April 22, 1985, as a Correctional Officer at Zephyrhills Correctional Institution. Over the years, he has been promoted through the ranks and has served as Warden of the Hernando Correctional Institution in Brooksville, Florida, for the past 11 years.

Warden Griffin was appointed to the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission on August 2, 2011, and reappointed by the Governor on August 2, 2015, serving on the 2016 Prejudicial Behavior Committee as well as the Officer Discipline Penalty Guidelines Task Force in 2015 and 2017. Warden Griffin was elected as vice-chair on August 7, 2014, and was elected to serve as Commission chair from August 10, 2017, to August 8, 2019.

During his tenure with the Commission and the Florida Department of Corrections, Warden Griffin welcomed the opportunity to be a public servant for, not only for the Commission, but also for the citizens of the State of Florida, for whom he served. Warden Griffin stated "I never thought that I would have the opportunity to be an officer for this Commission. Being elected as Vice-Chairman, and then, Chairman, was indeed the epitome of my career." The Commission congratulates Warden Griffin on his retirement and wishes him well in future endeavors.

## 36 Graduate from the *SENIOR LEADERSHIP PROGRAM* **CLASS 22**

**T**he Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute announces the graduation of 36 senior executives from the Senior Leadership Program on October 11, 2019. The graduates represent 26 criminal justice agencies from across the state.

Participants met for seven weeks over a 10-month period. They took classes on topics such as risk management, budgeting, leadership, and futures forecasting as it relates to criminal justice.

The goal of the Senior Leadership Program is to prepare Florida's criminal justice leadership for the challenging and changing demands of the future. Class participants study the trends and events that will challenge criminal justice professionals and the state in the new millennium and examine the leadership skills necessary to create and lead the changes that lie ahead.

The Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute, established within the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and affiliated with the State University System, was established in 1990 by the Florida Legislature to address the need for an innovative and multifaceted approach to the education and training of criminal justice professionals.



## **53<sup>rd</sup>** Class of the CHIEF EXECUTIVE SEMINAR

The Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute announces the graduation of the 53rd Class of the Chief Executive Seminar on November 21, 2019, at the Staybridge Suites, 1600 Summit Lake Drive in Tallahassee, Florida. The participants, who represent criminal justice agencies from around the state, serve in leadership roles within their agencies.

Twenty participants met for one week a month for three months, taking classes on topics such as future trends, managing generations, social media, succession planning and implementing strategic change.

The goal of the Chief Executive Seminar is to prepare Florida's criminal justice leadership for the challenging demands of the future. Class participants study trends and events that may affect criminal justice professionals and Florida, while developing new leadership skills to address the changes that lie ahead.

## **46<sup>th</sup>** Class of the FLORIDA LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

The Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute is proud to announce the launch of the 46th Florida Leadership Academy (FLA) Class hosted at the Boca Raton Police Department in Boca Raton, Florida, on September 23, 2019. The 40 class participants serve in leadership roles and represent 27 criminal justice agencies throughout the state including police departments, sheriff's offices, corrections, and state law enforcement.

Academy participants will meet for four week-long sessions from September to December. Participants will learn skills necessary to support the needs of their agencies and communities in preparation for future challenges. The goal of the FLA is to prepare first-line supervisors in criminal justice organizations to exemplify the character and integrity expected of criminal justice professionals, while examining the various components necessary to become efficient leaders.

The 46th FLA Class will graduate on Friday, December 13, 2019. The Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute is getting ready to release the dates and locations for the 2020 FLA 47th through 49th Classes.



# Danielle Terrell



## Appointed as Executive Director of the Florida Accreditation Office

During their October commission meetings, the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation (CFLA) and the Florida Corrections Accreditation Commission (FCAC) approved the appointment of Danielle Terrell as Executive Director of the Florida Accreditation Office (FAO).

Danielle previously worked in the FAO as the South Florida Program Manager for four years. She is familiar with the accreditation process and the dynamics of the CFLA and FCAC Commissions. She is also an experienced instructor, course

facilitator, recruiter, EEO coordinator, and policy liaison. Danielle has been with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement for over 21 years. She most recently served as the Senior Management Analyst Supervisor in FDLE's Office of Criminal Justice Grants. In this position, she oversaw a staff responsible for seven federal grants as well as State Financial Assistance Grants totaling over \$20 million. In her new

role, she will serve as staff to the CFLA and FCAC commissions and be responsible for the supervision and management of all aspects of the state accreditation process.

The state accreditation process is strong and growing with 167 law enforcement agencies, 35 Offices of Inspector Generals, 32 jails and seven pretrial and probation agencies currently accredited. State accreditation has seen a 30 percent increase in accredited agencies over the last five years. To meet the needs of the rising number of agencies participating in state accreditation,

the FAO has expanded its staff by adding a fourth program manager, offered more training opportunities at conferences and across the state and fostered relationships by participating regularly in the Florida Sheriffs Association and Florida Police Chiefs Association conferences.

To understand the needs of the accreditation community, the FAO has remained an engaged partner with the Florida Model Jail Standards Committee and the State Law Enforcement Chiefs Association. As a result of the developed partnerships and the involvement of the accreditation community, the FAO developed the Core Competencies program to eventually replace the Comparative Compliance program currently offered to CALEA-accredited agencies. This stand-alone program addresses life, health, and safety standards, as well as those standards specific to the State of Florida.

Executive Director Terrell is excited about the future of the FAO and plans to continue to foster the development of standards relating to best practices and statutory requirements as well as effectively lead and manage the state accreditation process through a time of constant change.



# ELECTION OF COMMISSION CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR

Pursuant to s. 943.11(2), F.S., the Commission shall annually elect its chair and other officers. In August 2019, Commission Attorney Nick Cox conducted the election of officers. Commissioner William “Willie” Weiss (former vice-chair) was elected as chair, and Commissioner David B. Shoar was elected to serve as vice-chair.

**Deputy Sheriff Weiss** has been in law enforcement for 31 years. He is currently serving the Martin County Sheriff’s Office and has been for the past 28 years. Deputy Weiss is currently assigned to the agency’s Community Operations Division in the capacity as Community Operations-Public Affairs and Emergency Management Deputy. As part of his multiple responsibilities, Deputy Weiss also serves as the staff supervisor for the agency’s Animal Services Unit, manages major emergency and operational assets, and is an agency firearms instructor/armorer. Deputy Weiss serves as the Commander of the agency’s Honor Guard, is an FBI-certified bomb technician, and manages the sheriff’s BBQ Grill Team, Explorer Post, and Posse. Deputy Weiss is an elected Representative for the Palm Beach County Police Benevolent Association and has represented Martin County Deputies for the last 15 years. Deputy Weiss has been the recipient of numerous law enforcement, public service and civic awards and commendations for officer of the year and month recognizing his service as an outstanding law enforcement officer. In 2013, Deputy Weiss was appointed by Governor Rick Scott to serve on the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission, serving on the Officer Discipline Penalty Guidelines Task Force from 2013 through 2019.



Sheriff David B. Shoar

**Sheriff David B. Shoar** began his law enforcement career as a police officer with the St. Augustine Police Department in December 1981. He served as a patrol officer for 10 years until his promotion to sergeant in 1991. In 1997, Sheriff Shoar was promoted to Operations Commander overseeing the Patrol and Detective Divisions. In 1999, he was assigned as the Administrative Services Commander and served in that capacity until May of 2000 when he was appointed Chief of Police. Sheriff Shoar retired from the St. Augustine Police Department in 2004 after being elected as Sheriff of St. Johns County, and has been re-elected for 3 consecutive terms. Sheriff Shoar has held many esteemed positions and earned several awards throughout his career. To name a few, in 2014, he was elected by his fellow sheriffs to serve as President of the Florida Sheriffs Association. In 2017, Sheriff Shoar was awarded the “Lifetime Achievement” award from Mental Health Inc. of North Florida for his many years of assisting those suffering from mental health disorders. In 2017, he was also awarded the prestigious “Colonel Ed Taylor” award from the Veterans Council of St. Johns County for his many years of dedication to our nation’s veterans. He currently serves as an adjunct professor at St. Johns River Community College in St. Augustine, Florida. Sheriff Shoar was appointed by the Governor to serve a partial term on the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission from September 2009 to August 2011. He was subsequently appointed full-term by Governor Rick Scott beginning August 2012, serving on the 2013 Officer Discipline Penalty Guidelines Task Force and the 2016 Prejudicial Behavior Committee.

# ACTIVE SHOOTER TRAINING is in Demand Across State

## FDLE invited to train instructors outside of Florida

Since the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission approved courses on Single Officer Response to Active Threat and Shooter Incidents in May 2019, FDLE has conducted 18 sessions of the Instructor course at criminal justice training schools throughout Florida. More than 200 instructors have taken the course since May, and many states have requested access to Florida's training.

The training is designed to give officers the tactics and mental preparation to respond to an active shooter situation by themselves. The course stresses that, in an active shooter incident, "time is lives." Therefore, law enforcement cannot wait for backup; they must immediately respond to the threat.

FDLE Assistant Commissioner Jennifer Pritt presented highlights from the course at an Association of State Criminal Investigative Agencies (ASCIA) conference in May 2019, in Gulf Shores, Alabama, and many of the agencies in attendance asked if the training could be made available to their states.

In September 2019, FDLE's Sworn Training Unit hosted a class in Orlando for out-of-state law enforcement agencies. Some of the participating agencies included Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI), Alabama Law Enforcement Agency, South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED), North Carolina State Bureau of Investigations (NBI), Texas Department of Public Safety (Texas Rangers), Pennsylvania State Police and Illinois State Police. The class was received so well that FDLE has been invited to conduct the training for criminal justice instructors in South Carolina.

There are two courses on this topic: Specialized course 1402 (Single Officer Response to Active Threat and Shooter Incidents) and the Instructor course 1403 (Single Officer Response to Active Threat and Shooter Incidents Instructor).

Course 1402 is designed to help officers learn the basics of responding to an active threat and uses classroom, live fire exercises and scenario-based training. Course 1403 is for firearms instructors and prepares them to teach the 1402 course by shadowing a lead instructor and assisting in teaching the 1402 course.




