Community Oriented Policing in Low-Income, Government Subsidized Housing Developments in Daytona Beach, Florida

This paper describes the problems that were being experienced in low-income, government subsidized housing developments in Daytona Beach and the organizational strategies developed and implemented to solve those problems.
