Leaders will address stressors encountered by their staff which influences the balance between professional and personal relationships.

Emphasis will be placed on executives, managers, and supervisors developing leadership practices and policies that recognize and encourage accomplishment of organizational goals while also taking better care of themselves and the people who serve under their leadership.

Supervisors and managers will leave the class with an understanding of a variety of best practices in addressing organizational stress. A theme of personal leadership will run throughout this seminar and attendees will have ample opportunities to share their views, develop decision-making models, and reflect on better ways to make decisions for themselves and those they lead.

Topics will include:

- Warning signs of distress and preventative programs to reduce and monitor it

Program at the University of Colorado. He has taught extensively on various courses related to leadership and organizational change. Additionally he has taught for more than 28 years on topics including use of force, weapons and tactics.
