This course will provide the user with an understanding of how justice, fairness and equality are interpreted within the complex criminal justice system, to include how it is viewed by members of our communities, our agencies and our command staff. This course is intended for leaders in law enforcement agencies who wish to explore how utilizing the concepts of procedural justice can improve relationships with everyone with whom they have contact. This course will cover in depth, the concepts of:

- Procedural Justice
- Critical Thinking and Decision Making
- Attitudes, Stereotypes and Perceptions
- Six Pillars for 21st Century Policing
- Internal and External Justice
- Guardian Vs. Warrior Mindset
- Change in Police Culture

The goal of this course is to provide the student with tools to be used at appropriate times which will provide them with outcomes which foster community support and understanding. Finally, the course will explore national police opinions regarding procedural justice and how to implement the concepts of fairness, equality and justice at all levels of your agency.

Instructor:

David Pate started his career in law enforcement with the Leon County Sheriff's Office in 1987. He served in Uniform Patrol, as a School Resource Deputy, Criminal Investigations, and after 09/11, as a Domestic Security Task Force Agent. He is currently a Captain with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation (FWC) Commission, having served in Internal Affairs, Advanced Training and now as the head of the Office of Professional Standards. He is active in the law enforcement accreditation community serving as a Team Leader for the Commission for Law Enforcement Accreditation, assessing law enforcement and inspector general agencies in Florida.

David holds a bachelor's degree in Public Administration and is a graduate of Senior Leadership Program (SLP) Class 10. He continues to serve the FCJEI as a mentor for the SLP and he teaches in the Florida Leadership Academy, and basic recruit and advanced law enforcement courses at the Florida Public Safety Institute.
