

MURDER

Murder is defined as the willful (nonnegligent) killing of a human being. Any death due to a fight, argument, quarrel, assault or commission of a crime is included. This index offense is scored by law enforcement officials on the basis of their investigation without regard to findings of a court or jury or the decision of a prosecutor. Traffic deaths, caused by the negligence of someone rather than the victim, are not included here, but are counted under manslaughter. Attempts to kill and assaults to kill are scored as assaults and not as murder. Suicides, accidental deaths, and justifiable or excusable homicides are also excluded.

1973—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 1,182 murders were reported by law enforcement agencies in Florida for the year 1973.

Murders accounted for 2.5 percent of all violent crimes and 0.3 percent of all index offenses reported.

The murder rate for the reporting period was 15.1 per 100,000 population.

A total of 972 murders were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared, amounting to an 82.2 percent clearance rate statewide.

The age group accounting for the highest percent of persons arrested for murder, 14.9 percent, occurred in the 25-29 category. Males accounted for 83.2 percent of all persons arrested for murder.

37.8 percent of all persons arrested for murder were White, 61.2 percent were Negro and 1.0 were of other races.

47.3 percent of all murder victims were White, 52.7 percent were Negro and no persons of other races were murdered. 69.7 percent of all murder victims were male.

Firearms were employed in 65.1 percent of all reported murders. The use of a knife or other cutting device was involved in 15.2 percent of the murders.

The murder of one family member by another accounted for 295 or 25.0 percent of all murders. Of these, 203 murders or 68.8 percent resulted from one spouse killing the other.

Altercations or quarrels between the victim and perpetrator, including money quarrels, lovers quarrels and drinking quarrels, accounted for 27.6 percent of all murders reported during the year 1973. Specifically, lovers quarrels recorded the highest involvement, accounting for 12.8 percent of the total murders.

1974—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 1,190 murders were reported by law enforcement agencies in Florida for the year 1974.

Murders accounted for 2.2 percent of all violent crimes and 0.2 percent of all index offenses reported.

The murder rate for the reporting period was 14.4 per 100,000 population.

A total of 999 murders were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared, amounting to an 83.9 percent clearance rate statewide.

The age group accounting for the highest percent of persons arrested for murder, 15.7 percent, occurred in the 25-29 category. Males accounted for 82.1 percent of all persons arrested for murder.

38.2 percent of all persons arrested for murder were White, 60.9 percent were Negro and 0.9 were of other races.

48.0 percent of all murder victims were White, 51.9 percent were Negro and 0.1 percent of other races were murdered. 75.7 percent of all murder victims were male.

Firearms were employed in 71.3 percent of all reported murders. The use of a knife or other cutting device was involved in 13.4 percent of the murders.

The murder of one family member by another accounted for 252 or 21.2 percent of all murders. Of these, 174 murders or 69.0 percent resulted from one spouse killing the other.

Altercations or quarrels between the victim and perpetrator, including money quarrels, lovers quarrels and drinking quarrels, accounted for 16.6 percent of all murders reported during the year 1974. Specifically, drinking quarrels recorded the highest involvement, accounting for 7.9 percent of the total murders.

1975—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 1,132 murders were reported by law enforcement agencies in Florida for the year 1975.

Murders accounted for 2.0 percent of all violent crimes and 0.2 percent of all index offenses reported.

The murder rate for the reporting period was 13.3 per 100,000 population.

A total of 925 murders were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared, amounting to an 81.7 percent clearance rate statewide.

The age group accounting for the highest percent of persons arrested for murder, 15.2 percent, occurred in the 25-29 age category. Males accounted for 80.1 percent of all persons arrested for murder.

43.4 percent of all persons arrested for murder were White, 56.1 percent were Negro and 0.5 were of other races.

50.9 percent of all murder victims were White, 49.1 percent were Negro and 0.0 percent of other races were murdered. 73.7 percent of all murder victims were male.

Firearms were employed in 66.0 percent of all reported murders. The use of a knife or other cutting device was involved in 13.4 percent of the murders.

The murder of one family member by another accounted for 262 or 23.1 percent of all murders. Of these, 186 murders or 71.0 percent resulted from one spouse killing the other.

Altercations or quarrels between the victim and perpetrator, including money quarrels, lovers quarrels and drinking quarrels, accounted for 18.3 percent of all murders reported during the year 1975. Specifically, drinking quarrels recorded the highest involvement, accounting for 5.9 percent of the total murders.

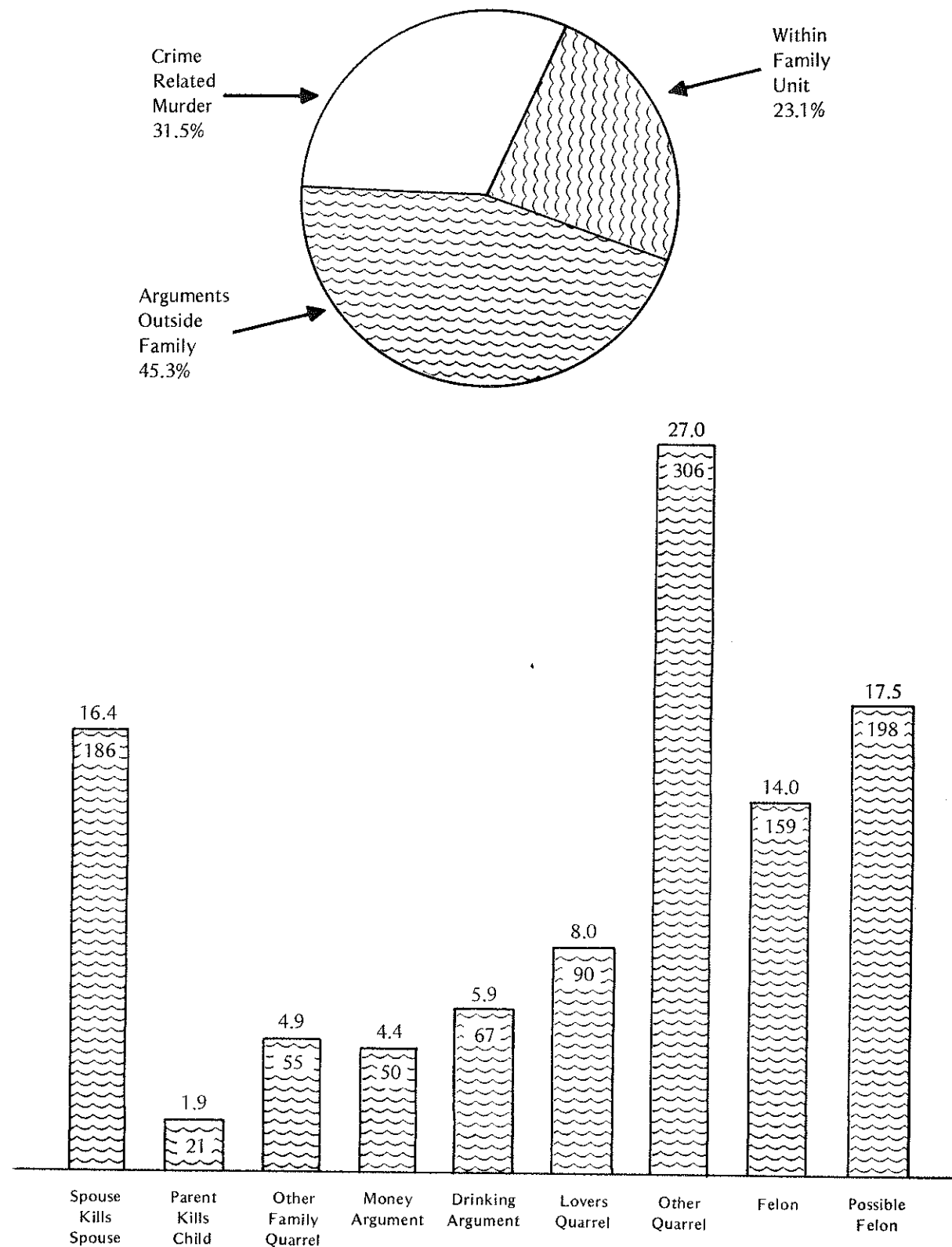
