The information included in this report is invaluable to the many interested parties well beyond the boundaries of our medical examiner districts. The MEC believes in the value and worth of compiling statewide data and providing it to the general public and policy makers alike.

The Report of Drugs Identified in Deceased Persons provides highly sought after and critical information related to drug deaths in Florida. This unique report continues to track the unfortunate results of the abuse of both prescription and illicit drugs. The report assists Florida's state and local agencies in allocating and focusing their precious resources. Dating back to 1987, this annual report was first conceptualized for tracking deaths due to cocaine, with heroin later added in 1995. The report is constantly evolving. More drugs are tracked as their abuse potential and prevalence becomes known. The Report of Drugs Identified in Deceased Persons has currently evolved to include the tracking of 42 drugs and ethanol.

One of the MEC's proudest accomplishments continues to be its joint initiative with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) and Florida's 25 medical examiner districts as we attempt to resolve the approximately 900 unidentified deceased persons in our state. With new technology and advances in forensic science, this project continues to pay dividends for many families seeking closure of a loved one's fate. We will continue to encourage participation and provide access to various resources to reduce the backlog of these unidentified deaths.

Thank you for your ongoing professional commitment to providing the State of Florida with high quality medical-legal death investigative services. This is very much a team effort and you are to be commended for your exemplary efforts and professionalism.

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INTRODUCTION

The Medical Examiners Act, Chapter 406, Part I, Florida Statutes, was enacted by the 1970 Legislature in order to establish minimum and uniform standards of excellence in statewide medical examiner services. This report is compiled to illustrate the direction taken by the Medical Examiners Commission (MEC) during 2022 to ensure an effective and viable program of medical examiner services throughout Florida.

COMMISSION RETIREMENTS

Resolution

Commission member Carol Whitmore lost her bid for re-election as the Manatee County At-Large Commissioner – District 6 and left the MEC at the end of 2022. The Honorable Carol Whitmore served the citizens of Florida as a county commissioner for 16 years and was appointed to the MEC in August 2013 by Governor Rick Scott to represent the concerns of Florida's county commissioners.

MEDICAL EXAMINER DISTRICTS

In 2022, the Commission recommended that the medical examiners for Districts 10, 12 and 14 be reappointed by the Governor for additional three-year terms.

District 10 Dr. Stephen Nelson
District 12 Dr. Russell Vega
District 14 Dr. Jay Radtke

Surveys for the reappointments of district medical examiners for Districts 8 (Alachua, Baker, Bradford, Gilchrist, Levy and Union counties), 10 (Hardee, Highlands and Polk counties), 12 (DeSoto, Manatee and Sarasota counties) and 14 (Bay, Calhoun, Gulf, Holmes, Jackson and Washington counties) were mailed to the constituents of these districts in January.

Assessments were sent to the constituents of District 3 (Dixie County), 9 (Orange County), 11 (Miami-Dade County), 13 (Hillsborough County) and 25 (Osceola County) for information only. District 3 receives medical examiner services through contractual agreements with District 8. Districts 9, 11, 13 and 25 fall under Home Rule Charter and the medical examiners are not appointed by the Governor. Dr. Joshua D. Stephany continued to serve as the district medical examiner for District 9 and 25, Dr. Kenneth Hutchins continued to serve as the district medical examiner for District 11 and Dr. Kelly G. Devers continued to serve as the district medical examiner for District 13.

Thomas Coyne, M.D., was named the District 8 Interim Medical Examiner effective October 17, 2022.

Kenneth Hutchins, M.D., was named the District 11 Medical Examiner effective January 27, 2022.

DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

There was a total of eight formal complaints in 2022. Of the eight cases received, all eight were found to be legally insufficient by staff, without the need for review by a probable cause panel.

ANNUAL EDUCATIONAL CONFERENCE

The 48th Annual Educational Conference of the Florida Association of Medical Examiners was held at the Omni Orlando at Championsgate in Orlando, Florida.

STATE CHILD ABUSE DEATH REVIEW COMMITTEE

District 9 and 25 Associate Medical Examiner Shanedelle S. Norford, M.D., continued to serve as the Florida Medical Examiners Commission representative on the statewide Child Abuse Death Review Committee.

VIOLENT CRIME AND DRUG CONTROL COUNCIL

District 12 Medical Examiner Russell S. Vega, M.D., continued to serve on the Violent Crime and Drug Control Council as the statutorily mandated medical examiner (F.S. §943.931(2)(i)).

UNIDENTIFIED DECEASED INITIATIVE

Unidentified deceased success stories can be attributed to many of the tools that are available to medical examiners and law enforcement when investigating unidentified decedents. Some of these tools include the NCIC/FCIC database, which contains missing person records and can include fingerprint and dental records; the Florida Unidentified Decedents Database (www.fluiddb.com); the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System "NamUs" (www.NamUS.gov); and the Unidentified Deceased Initiative online training video, which was developed by FDLE's Bureau of Professional Development and the Missing Endangered Persons Information Clearinghouse (MEPIC).

MEPIC is available to assist in the identification of unidentified medical examiner cases. Their staff can provide assistance with DNA status, fingerprint submissions, dental records, FCIC/NCIC queries on active missing persons cases, resource information, forensic artists and the opening of cases. The Department of Homeland Security and Immigration and Customs Enforcement have fingerprint databases from undocumented aliens they have encountered. These databases are not tied into the FBI database. MEPIC can assist the medical examiners in submitting fingerprints through these databases if other avenues fail to produce results.

Eight success stories were reported during 2022 from Districts 6, 15, 17, 19, 20 and 21. The number of solved cases has grown significantly due to the analytical and investigative efforts of the MEPIC staff. This has been especially helpful in the identification of decedents who were foreign nationals.

District 6

• On December 27, 2016, Pinellas County deputies responded to Darby Lane for a report of a missing person. They were notified the 34-year-old Rang Truong fled on foot from his brother's vehicle and was unable to be located. Deputies searched the area in an attempt to find him, but were unsuccessful. He was entered into FCIC/NCIC as a Missing/Endangered Person due to reported intellectual disabilities and other mental health concerns. On January 18, 2022, detectives learned that the St. Petersburg Police Department was investigating a report of unidentified remains found near the area of Interstate 275, near the Howard Franklin Bridge, and responded to the scene. Detectives provided the District 6 Medical Examiner's

Office with Truong's information as a possible identity of the human remains. With the use of dental records, the remains were positively identified as Truong's. The medical examiner's office is working to determine the cause and manner of death, and the next of kin has been notified.

District 15

• Human remains were discovered tied up in the mangroves with a wire to a tree in North Palm Beach by Singer Island in Palm Beach County in 1974. An examination at the time revealed the remains belong to an approximately 14-year old white female. The remains were maintained elsewhere until 2014 when they were turned over to District 15 - Palm Beach County Medical Examiner's Office. Mitochondrial DNA samples were obtained and sent into NamUS. Subsequently the remains were submitted for an osteological exam and a forensic dental evaluation. None of these led to a positive identification at that time. On March 18, 2022, the Palm Beach County Medical Examiner's Office was advised by the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office that the remains had been identified via DNA as a 17-year-old white female named Susan Gail Poole, DOB: 02/12/1957. The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office had been in touch with Poole's family (mother, brother and sister) and they reported she went missing in 1972. Poole's mother provided a DNA standard, which confirmed Poole's identity. Susan Gail Poole was released from the Palm Beach County Medical Examiner's Office on June 2, 2022 via funeral home to Poole's sister, bringing the identification of the case to a close. The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office believes Poole was one of the victims slain by Gerard Schaefer, a police officer who was also a serial killer. Schaefer was stabbed to death in prison in 1995.

District 17

- On March 15, 2021, skeletal remains of an adult male were found in a wooded area in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. At the time, there were no leads on a possible identification of the decedent and all efforts to identify the decedent yielded negative results. DNA from the decedent was subsequently submitted to CODIS. On May 6, 2022, we received a CODIS Offender Hit Notification matching the DNA from the decedent to a convicted offender/arrestee. Law enforcement investigated and was able to notify the decedent's family of the death.
- On March 25, 2022, skeletal remains of an adult male were found inside a tent in a wooded area in Sunrise, Florida. Through the scene investigation, a Maine state identification card was found nearby belonging to a 24-year-old male. Upon further investigation, the parents of the person on the ID card were contacted and advised this individual was traveling from place to place and they had not seen or heard from him in several months. The parents also advised that this individual and his brother were adopted as young children from overseas. The adult brother consented to a voluntary buccal swab for DNA that later matched to the decedent for a positive identification.
- On June 16, 2021, skeletal remains of an adult male were found outside a business in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. At the time, there were no leads on a possible identification of the decedent and all efforts to identify the decedent yielded negative results. DNA from the decedent was subsequently submitted to CODIS. On May 3, 2022, we received a CODIS Offender Hit Notification matching the DNA from the decedent to a convicted offender/arrestee. Law enforcement investigated and was able to notify the decedent's family of the death.

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District 19

• On July 13, 2020, the Martin County Sheriff's Office notified investigators at the District 19 Medical Examiner's Office of unidentified remains found in an overgrown grassy area just west of the railroad tracks in the vicinity of Railroad Avenue and SE Garden Street in Stuart. Investigator Kimberly Loucks arrived on scene and observed what appeared to be a Caucasian male lying approximately 50-60 feet from the railroad tracks. Evidence found near the body indicated the decedent was possibly drinking alcohol and ingesting Kratom prior to death. No obvious signs of trauma or foul play were seen. Due to advanced stages of decomposition, fingerprinting was nearly impossible. Forensic Technician Gibbons attempted to rehydrate the decedent's fingers to obtain fingerprints for identification. Her diligence and consistent effort paid off and prints were able to be obtained. Fingerprint cards were made and turned over to analysts at the Martin County Sheriff's Office. On December 3, 2021, a fingerprint comparison was made and matched to those of Richard Harmon Whitton. Mr. Whitton's mother reported him missing from the Stuart area and had not heard from him in over a year.

District 20

• On May 3, 2002, deputies responded to reports of a body floating near the shore. The agency's Marine Unit and detectives searched the area and recovered the body, which was about 1.5 miles north of Doctor's Pass in Collier County. The District 20 Medical Examiner had classified the death as Undetermined based on the circumstances of the recovery. No criminality was ever established to indicate any persons contributed to the death of the decedent. The body had no identification on it, so detectives compared fingerprints through the FDLE database and the National Automated Fingerprint Identification System several times over the following years without success. Detectives also entered the decedent into NCIC as unidentified remains. The decedent's DNA profile and dental information as well as fingerprints and a composite sketch were entered into the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System (NamUs). On November 23, 2021, a positive match was made between the fingerprints submitted to NamUs and the Armed Forces fingerprint card of Edward Lorenz Richard, which had been prepared on November 15, 1972, when he enlisted. Upon Collier County Sheriff's Office receiving notification of the match, detectives were able to locate Richard's brother and adult son in Massachusetts the following day. Family members said he left Massachusetts by bus and headed to Florida about 20 years before his 2002 death. At the time of his departure, he had given all of his identification cards to family and they had not heard from him since.

District 21

• After the skeletal remains of eight men were found back in 2007 in a wooded area of east Fort Myers, authorities have been working diligently to identify them. DNA analyses have helped authorities name three of the men and on Tuesday, they were able to identify a fourth man. His name was Robert Ronald "Bobbie" Soden, Fort Myers Police Department said in a news release. The Fort Myers Police Department Cold Case Unit said Soden was 30 when he was last heard from and investigators were able to tie him to the Fort Myers area around the time of his suspected death. The police department was able to locate relatives of Soden in New Jersey, North Carolina and Washington. In order to properly identify the remains, the cold case unit has been working with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and Parabon Nanolabs, a private DNA analysis company. The company uses a genealogy research program that works with DNA collected from the skeletal remains, identifies a probable person and then investigators contact potential family members to complete the DNA comparison. It's believed that Soden could have been killed by a serial killer active in east Fort Myers in the 1990s. Police said Soden's remains were found

in the same area as other victims. Daniel Conahan was known as the "Hog Trail Killer" and identified as a person of interest during the ongoing investigation, Fort Myers police said. Conahan is currently on death row in Florida for a Charlotte County murder in 1996. "Investigators submitted DNA profiles for each of the eight male skeletons to the University of North Texas Center for Human Identification," Fort Myers Police said. "The database is a national clearinghouse for DNA profiles of missing persons and unidentified dead." Through DNA samples collected from family members of reported missing people, they have been able to identify three of the other skeletal remains in addition to that of Soden. Their names are Jonathan Tihay, Johnathan Blevins and Eric Kohler. "The investigation will not stop until all eight of the victims are identified and their families are notified," investigators say.

METHODOLOGY

Death statistics in Florida reflect the total number of certificates of death recorded by local county registrars of vital statistics. These include both resident and non-resident deaths. Data for 2022 was obtained from the Department of Health, Office of Vital Statistics. Rates related to deaths in this report are medical examiner cases per every 1,000 recorded deaths.

Population estimates for the state of Florida (as of April 1, 2021) were provided by the Florida Legislature's Office of Economic and Demographic Research. Unless otherwise noted, rates related to population in this report are deaths for every 1,000 residents.

Information concerning autopsy numbers and other workload distribution figures are supplied by each of the 25 medical examiner districts on the Annual Report Workload Data Form. These forms are filed annually with the MEC staff within the Florida Department of Law Enforcement by May 31 of each year.

Deaths included in this report are classified as "Natural" or "Violent." It should be noted that, for the purposes of this report, the term "Violent" includes all non-natural deaths.


