INTRODUCTION

The Medical Examiners Act, Chapter 406, Part I, Florida Statutes, was enacted by the 1970 Legislature in order to establish minimum and uniform standards of excellence in statewide medical examiner services. This report is compiled to illustrate the direction taken by the Medical Examiners Commission during 2012 to ensure the maintenance of an effective and viable program of medical examiner services throughout Florida.

COMMISSION APPOINTMENTS AND VACANCIES

At the end of 2012, the Commission anticipated two vacant seats. County Commissioner Donna G. Hayes retired in November 2012, which created the first vacancy and Monroe County Sheriff Robert Peryam retired in January 2013. Recommendations have been sent to the Governor for consideration to fill both vacancies.

MEDICAL EXAMINER DISTRICTS

In 2012, the Commission recommended that the district medical examiners from Districts 1, 2, 4, 5, and 6 be reappointed by the Governor for additional three-year terms.

- District 1: Andrea N. Minyard, M.D.
- District 2: David T. Steward, M.D.
- District 4: Valerie J. Rao, M.D.
- District 5: Barbara C. Wolf, M.D.
- District 6: Jon R. Thogmartin, M.D.

Surveys were sent to the constituents of District 7 for information only as that district falls under a Home Rule Charter. Marie A. Herrmann, M.D. of District 7 (Volusia County) continued as the district medical examiner. Surveys were also sent to the constituents of District 3 for information only as that district is cross-covered by Districts 2, 4, and 8.

Mary K. Mainland, M.D. replaced Vernard Adams, M.D. as the District 13 medical examiner. Dr. Adams resigned in June 2012 after serving 21 years as District 13 medical examiner.

Michael Hensley retired in December 2012 after serving as the director of operations for the District 5 medical examiner for three years.

Mr. Larry R. Bedore retired in December 2012 after serving as the director of investigations/operations for Districts 5, 6, and 8 medical examiners since 1984. Mr. Bedore was an active participant on numerous MEC committees and working groups for the past three decades.

IN MEMORIAM

Terrence Roy Steiner, M.D. passed away on November 14, 2012. Dr. Steiner was the District 23 medical examiner from 1990 through 2010.

Former District 15 Medical Examiner Jim Benz, M.D. passed away in February 2012. He was the medical examiner from 1983 until 1995.

DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

In 2012, Commission staff received 13 formal written complaints against district medical examiners or their associate medical examiners. All of these complaints alleged misconduct regarding the findings of cause and/or manner of death. Most of these cases were found not legally sufficient by staff, without need for review by a Probable Cause Panel. One case went before a Probable Cause Panel but was found by the Panel to be not legally sufficient.

ANNUAL EDUCATIONAL CONFERENCE

The 39th Annual Educational Conference was held July 11-13, 2012 at the Sandpearl Resort in Clearwater Beach, Florida. The conference was jointly sponsored by District 16 Medical Examiner E. Hunt Scheuerman, M.D., the University of Florida College of Medicine, and the William R. Maples Center for Forensic Medicine.

STATE CHILD FATALITY REVIEW COMMITTEE

The Child Abuse Death Review Committee (CADRC) is statutorily required to carefully review children whose deaths have been investigated by the Department of Children and Families and closed with a “verified” finding of child abuse or neglect. District 5 Medical Examiner Barbara Wolf, M.D. serves as the MEC representative on the committee and provided this report.

The CADRC received 126 child death cases that occurred in 2011 for review during the period January through November 2012. Four cases were verified after the review period and will be reported in 2013. One-hundred twenty-six victims were younger than 18 years old; and of the victims, 83 percent were under the age of five, 30 percent died from abuse and 70 percent died from neglect.

The causes of death due to neglect were:

- Drowning: 32 (25 percent);
- Unsafe sleeping environments: 30 (24 percent);
- Motor vehicle related: 10 (8 percent);
- Medical neglect: 7 (6 percent);
- Drug toxicity deaths: 5 (4 percent); and
- Firearm-related: 4 (3 percent)

When reviewing the cases with verified findings of death due to child abuse, the CADRC attempts to determine whether the child’s death was preventable. Based on the data collected and analyzed from the 126 child deaths reviewed, the committee identified five key recommendations for the Governor and Legislature to consider in an effort to prevent child abuse and neglect-related deaths:

- Florida lawmakers should amend the statutes governing the scope of responsibilities of the Statewide Child Abuse Death Review Committee to include all reported child fatalities accepted by the Abuse Hotline for an investigation;
- The DOH central office, DCF, hospitals, the Florida Pediatric Society, county health departments, Healthy Families Florida, Healthy Start and similar resources should submit information to the Statewide Child Abuse Death Review Committee by September 30, 2013 describing present practices in teaching parents infant sleep safety;
- Targeted prevention campaigns specific to drowning in residential pools and bath tubs should be developed;
- To avoid the costly consequences of child abuse and neglect, the legislature should increase the funding level for Healthy Families Florida, a program proven to prevent child abuse and neglect and improve the health, safety and well-being of children in high-risk families; and
- Local DCF offices and subcontracted Community-Based Care (CBC) agencies should develop formal partnerships and referral processes with local certified domestic violence centers to enhance the safety of families experiencing domestic violence.

METHODOLOGY

Death statistics in Florida reflect the total number of certificates of death recorded by local county registrars of vital statistics. These include both resident and non-resident deaths. Data for 2012 was obtained from the Department of Health Office of Vital Statistics. Rates related to deaths in this report are medical examiner cases per every 1,000 recorded deaths.

Population estimates for the state of Florida as of April 1, 2012 were provided by the Finance and Economic Analysis Section of the Executive Office of the Governor. Unless otherwise noted, rates related to population in this report are deaths for every 100,000 residents.

Information concerning autopsy numbers and other workload distribution figures are supplied by each of the 24 medical examiner districts on the Annual Report Workload Data Form. These forms are filed annually with the Medical Examiners Commission staff unit within the Florida Department of Law Enforcement in July of each year (see tables I and Ia).



Total Deaths Reviewed: 145,177



Total Florida Deaths: 178,730



Total Violent Deaths: 14,319



Total Florida Deaths: 178,730




Total Deaths Accepted: 22,074



Total Homicides: 1,284



Total Suicides: 3,025



Total Undetermined: 387



Total Accident: Motor Vehicle: 2,705



Total Accident: Non-Motor Vehicle: 6,833




