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INTRODUCTION

The Medical Examiners Act, Chapter 406, Part I, Florida Statutes, was enacted by the 1970 Legislature in order to establish minimum and uniform standards of excellence in statewide medical examiner services. This report is compiled to illustrate the direction taken by the Medical Examiners Commission (MEC) during 2013 to ensure the maintenance of an effective and viable program of medical examiner services throughout Florida.

COMMISSION APPOINTMENTS

New Appointments

Ms. Robin Giddens Sheppard, a licensed funeral home director, was appointed to fill the seat previously held by the late Jon Thomas, LFD, who resigned his appointment on May 1st. Commissioner Giddens Sheppard's term of appointment ends July 1, 2016.

Honorable Rick Beseler, Clay County Sheriff, was appointed for a four-year term to fill the seat vacated by Honorable Robert Peryam, Monroe County sheriff, who retired after 30 years of service. Commissioner Beseler's term of appointment ends July 1, 2017.

Honorable Carol Whitmore, Manatee County Commissioner, was appointed to fill the seat vacated by former Manatee County Commissioner Donna G. Hayes. Commissioner Whitmore's term ends July 1, 2017.

Reappointment

Honorable James Purdy, J.D., Public Defender, 7th Judicial Circuit was reappointed for a four-year term ending on July 1, 2017.

MEDICAL EXAMINER DISTRICTS

In 2013, upon the Commission's recommendation, the Governor reappointed the incumbent district medical examiners for districts 1, 2, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 12, and 14.

The appointment of district medical examiners for Districts 8, 9, 10, 12, and 14 ended on June 30, 2013. To assist the Commission in making recommendations to the Governor, surveys were sent via email to the constituents of these districts to obtain feedback regarding the quality of services provided by the medical examiners in these districts. The response rate was excellent and the overwhelming majority of responses were favorable.

Upon the Governor's request, District 4 formed a search committee to identify additional candidates for the position of District 4 Medical Examiner. At the close of 2013, the search committee had received five applications and scheduled initial interviews with the candidates.

The Commission approved the transfer of service for Lafayette County and Suwannee County from District 4 to District 2.

IN MEMORIAM

Dr. Joseph Harrison Davis (aka Dr. Joe Davis) passed away on March 19, 2013. Dr. Davis was the chief medical examiner for Miami-Dade County for 40 years. He played an instrumental role in inspiring and drafting Florida's medical examiner legislation. Dr. Davis was a charter member of the Medical Examiners Commission and served for 26 years, nine of them as the chairman.

Jon Charles Thomas, Sr., a licensed funeral director and a member of the Medical Examiners Commission for five years, passed away June 12, 2013.

Mr. Dean Smith passed away Saturday, Nov. 9, 2013. Mr. Smith served the District 9 medical examiner's office for 30 years as a medico-legal death investigator.

DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

In 2013, Commission staff received seven formal written complaints against district medical examiners or associate medical examiners. All of these complaints alleged misconduct regarding the findings of cause and/or manner of death. Six of the seven complaints were found not legally sufficient by staff, without need for review by a Probable Cause Panel. One case went before a Probable Cause Panel but was found by the Panel to be not legally sufficient.

ANNUAL EDUCATIONAL CONFERENCE

The 40th Annual Educational Conference of the Florida Association of Medical Examiners was held in Sarasota, Florida at the Ritz Carlton from July 10th through 12th. Attendance at the conference was approximately 100. The late Dr. Joe Davis, medical examiner for Miami-Dade for over four decades, was honored during the conference.

STATE CHILD FATALITY REVIEW COMMITTEE

District 5 Medical Examiner Barbara Wolf, M.D., the Commission's representative on the State Child Abuse Death Review Committee (SCADRC), reported to the Commission at its June meeting that the State Surgeon General and Secretary of the Department of Health, who appoints members to the committee, was working to revamp the SCADRC, and intends to introduce legislation that may eliminate the need for a district medical examiner/licensed forensic pathologist on the committee. The Surgeon General's vision is to have all child abuse death reviews performed by local committees, where the input of a district medical examiner can be provided, and have the state team look at trends. Local child abuse death review committees are formed at the direction of the Surgeon General, pursuant to ss. 383.402(6) - (18), F.S.

Dr. Wolf also addressed HB 725, relating to public records and public meetings exemptions, which was passed by the 2013 Legislature, but vetoed by the Governor. The bill sought to remove the recording requirements for closed meeting portions of the SCADRC and its local counterparts. Dr. Wolf explained that this provision existed in law previously, but was allowed to sunset. HB 725 was an attempt to return confidentiality to closed portions of state and local review team proceedings by eliminating the need for those closed portions to be recorded.

UNIDENTIFIED DECEASED INITIATIVE

One success story was reported during 2013. MEC staff partnered with the Missing and Endangered Persons Information Clearinghouse (MEPIC) staff to identify the remains of an elderly man reported missing more than 5 years ago.

Success stories can be attributed to many of the tools that are available to medical examiners and law enforcement when investigating unidentified decedents. Some of these tools include the NCIC/FCIC database, which contains missing person records and can include fingerprint and dental records; the Florida Unidentified Decedents Database (www.fluiddb.com); and the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System (www.NamUS.gov).

Mr. Michael Nance, the regional system administrator for the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System (NamUs), was an exhibitor at the Florida International Association for Identification Conference from October 20 – 24, 2013, at the Miami Hilton on Biscayne Boulevard. He was available to provide training on NamUs software changes.

METHODOLOGY

Death statistics in Florida reflect the total number of certificates of death recorded by local county registrars of vital statistics. These include both resident and non-resident deaths. Data for 2013 was obtained from the Department of Health Office of Vital Statistics. Rates related to deaths in this report are medical examiner cases per every 1,000 recorded deaths.

Population estimates for the state of Florida as of April 1, 2013 were provided by the Finance and Economic Analysis Section of the Executive Office of the Governor. Unless otherwise noted, rates related to population in this report are deaths for every 100,000 residents.

Information concerning autopsy numbers and other workload distribution figures are supplied by each of the 24 medical examiner districts on the Annual Report Workload Data Form. These forms are filed annually with the MEC staff within the Florida Department of Law Enforcement in July of each year (see tables I and Ia).

Deaths included in this report are classified as "Natural" or "Violent." It should be noted that, for the purposes of this report, the term "Violent" includes all non-natural deaths.



Total Deaths Reviewed: 151,809



Total Florida Deaths: 182,965



Total Violent Deaths: 14,365



Total Florida Deaths: 182,965




Chart IIIb

Total Deaths Accepted: 22,229



Total Homicides: 1,245



Total Suicides: 2,953



Total Undetermined: 397



Total Accident: Motor Vehicle: 2,661



Total Accident: Non-Motor Vehicle: 7,044




