#### 2018 Legislation: SB 7026

Senate Bill 7026 included:

- MSD Public Safety Commission
- Creation of the Office of Safe Schools
- Designation of a School Safety Specialist in each district
- FortifyFL
- · Safe-School Officer requirement
- · Coach Aaron Feis Guardian Program
- Expansion of mental health efforts
- School Self-Assessment requirement (FSSAT)
- · Additional funds for school safety and mental health
- · Safety training and drill requirements

#### 2019 Legislation: SB 7030

#### Senate Bill 7030 included:

- Development of a behavioral threat assessment tool
- · Requirement for SESIR rule for incident reporting
- Clarification of school safety requirements for charter schools
- School Hardening and Harm Mitigation Workgroup
- Requirements for promoting FortifyFL by school districts
- Compliance authority for FDOE on school safety issues

#### 2020 Legislation: SB 70

#### Senate Bill 70 included:

- Requirement for all Florida public schools, including charters, to implement a mobile panic alert system to ensure real-time coordination between multiple first responder agencies
- System must integrate with local public safety infrastructure to transmit 911 calls and mobile activations
- \$6.4 million in recurring state funds for "Alyssa's Alert"

## 2021 Legislation: SB 590

Senate Bill 590 included:

- Parent notification prior to involuntary examination (Baker Act)
- District reporting of Baker Act data to DOE
- Requirement for student IDs to include crisis and suicide hotline information
- Timely notification to parents of threats, unlawful acts and significant emergencies
- Changes to codes of student conduct regarding diversionary programs

#### Office of Safe Schools - Background

- Created by Senate Bill 7026 in 2018 with 3 positions
- DOE realigned 10 positions for the Office, to include 6 regional compliance and support personnel
- Currently staffed at 18 positions

## **Regional Staff Assigned to Visit Schools**

#### **Compliance Authority**

Announced and unannounced monitoring visits to schools

 School visits are documented via the Florida Safe School Assessment Tool (FSSAT)

- Staff provide technical assistance and guidance on safety requirements and best practices
- Issues are relayed for prompt remediation

### **Enhancing Compliance Efforts**

- Rule 6A-1.0018, F.A.C., was adopted by the State Board of Education in June 2021
- Establishes procedures for the Office of Safe Schools (OSS) to use while monitoring school districts and public schools:
  - Identify concerns of noncompliance
  - Clarify steps to be taken to address any issues in a timely manner
  - Expectations for communication in and between districts, schools and OSS

#### Rule 6A-1.0018, F.A.C.

Focuses on 12 specific statutory requirements relating to school safety, reporting and training, such as:

- Safe-school officer on every campus
- Threat assessment teams training, composition, etc.
- Active assailant response plan/training
- SESIR reporting
- · Emergency drills
- Promoting FortifyFL
- Alyssa's Alert mobile panic alert system

#### Amending Rule 6A-1.0018

Forthcoming amendment to the rule to clarify expectations and incorporate new legislative requirements:

- Alyssa's Alert implementation specifics
- SB 590 Policies for timely notification to parents of threats and the unlawful acts or significant emergencies
- SB 590 Emergency drill accommodations for ESE centers

# **2021** Changes to School Environmental Safety Incident Reporting (SESIR) in Rule

- Monthly SESIR data reporting by districts (6A-1.0014)
- New requirements from the U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights for reporting allegations of sexual assault and sexual battery by school personnel and any preliminary action taken (6A-1.0017)
- Changes to incident definitions based on feedback from districts and to provide greater clarity in reporting expectations (6A-1.0017)








Do you have a policy or written procedures to address coverage at your schools, including charter schools, in the event the assigned safe-school officer is absent for part or all of the school day?



















Have all district employees received training on the district's active assailant plan/procedure apart from merely providing the plan/procedure itself?







Does every school in your district conduct an active assailant drill at least one time per month?










Can every school employee immediately receive communications about an observed threat and any directive to initiate an active assailant response?
