Crime Prevention & Awareness Training

Since 1973, the officers of the Capitol Police have provided a safe environment for the thousands of people who work in and visit the Florida Capitol each day. The Capitol Police Crime Prevention Team was created and serves as a liaison for extending the necessary training to members of the Capitol community. The Crime Prevention Team is committed to improving awareness, and sharing the fundamentals of crime prevention in order to ensure that our work community is safe and secure. This brochure contains a listing of the crime prevention and awareness training classes that are currently offered by the Capitol Police Crime Prevention Team.

Active Shooter Awareness

This class is designed to provide State of Florida employees with the knowledge and information needed to safely respond to an active shooter situation. Participants will learn tips and techniques that will help them mentally and physically prepare for this type of stressful situation.

Workplace Violence

Violence in the workplace is a serious safety and health issue. Its extreme form, homicide, is the fourth-leading cause of fatal occupational injury in the United States. This class will teach participants ways to avoid violence in the workplace and how to handle tumultuous situations that may arise.



Personal Safety

Our Personal Safety program shows employees what hazards exist in office environments and every day life, and how important it is to use good safety practices during daily activities.

Office Security

Many steps can be taken to create a more secure and safe office environment. Our crime prevention professionals will discuss measures such as controlling access, greeting visitors, office design and steps to remove or reduce the opportunity for crime within the office setting.

Identity Theft

Identity theft is a crime in which the imposter obtains key pieces of information such as Social Security number, driver's license number, computer username and password, and uses them for his or her own gain. Victims are left with a tainted reputation and the complicated task of restoring their good names and credit. The Identity Theft class teaches participants how to reduce the chances of becoming an identity theft victim.



Fire Safety and Prevention

The Fire Safety, Protection, and Prevention program looks at what causes workplace fires and what can be done to prevent them. It reviews steps that can be taken to help prevent fires, as well as what employees should do in case of a fire emergency.

Floor Warden Training

This training ensures that floor wardens have a clear understanding of their responsibilities in the event of an emergency.

Rape and Aggression Defense for Women

(R.A.D.) - RAD is a women's self-empowerment program that teaches risk reduction strategies and physical maneuvers for personal safety in every day life.



Suspicious Packages and Bomb Threats

Do you know what to do if someone in your office receives or finds a suspicious package? What should you do if you receive a bomb threat over the telephone? This class teaches participants sensible steps they can take to minimize the risk and danger of suspicious packages or bomb threats.



Bomb Threat Coordination Training for Managers

This class is designed to explain the responsibilities of agency managers in response to a bomb threat. This class uses an Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms (ATF) PowerPoint that focuses on elements of a bomb threat/crisis management plan and general bomb search procedures.
