FLORIDA LAW ENFORCEMENT ANALYST ACADEMY TO CERTIFY 29 ANALYSTS

The Florida Law Enforcement Analyst Academy is proud to announce the upcoming graduation and certification of 29 law enforcement analysts scheduled for May 22, 2026. Analysts who attend the academy meet one week a month for six months. The analysts are challenged with weekly assignments and quizzes, group and individual projects, and a comprehensive final exam. Successful graduates are designated by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) as a Certified Law Enforcement Analyst.

The Florida Law Enforcement Analyst Academy was developed by FDLE in 2003 with the goal of providing analysts with the opportunity to sharpen their criminal and intelligence analysis skills. The curriculum for this academy is frequently updated to ensure that it remains relevant and up-to-date as technology evolves. The academy provides resources and tools to assist the analysts in their mission to predict and prevent criminal activity. With the graduation of this class, 40 academies will have been delivered, and 959 analysts will have been certified.

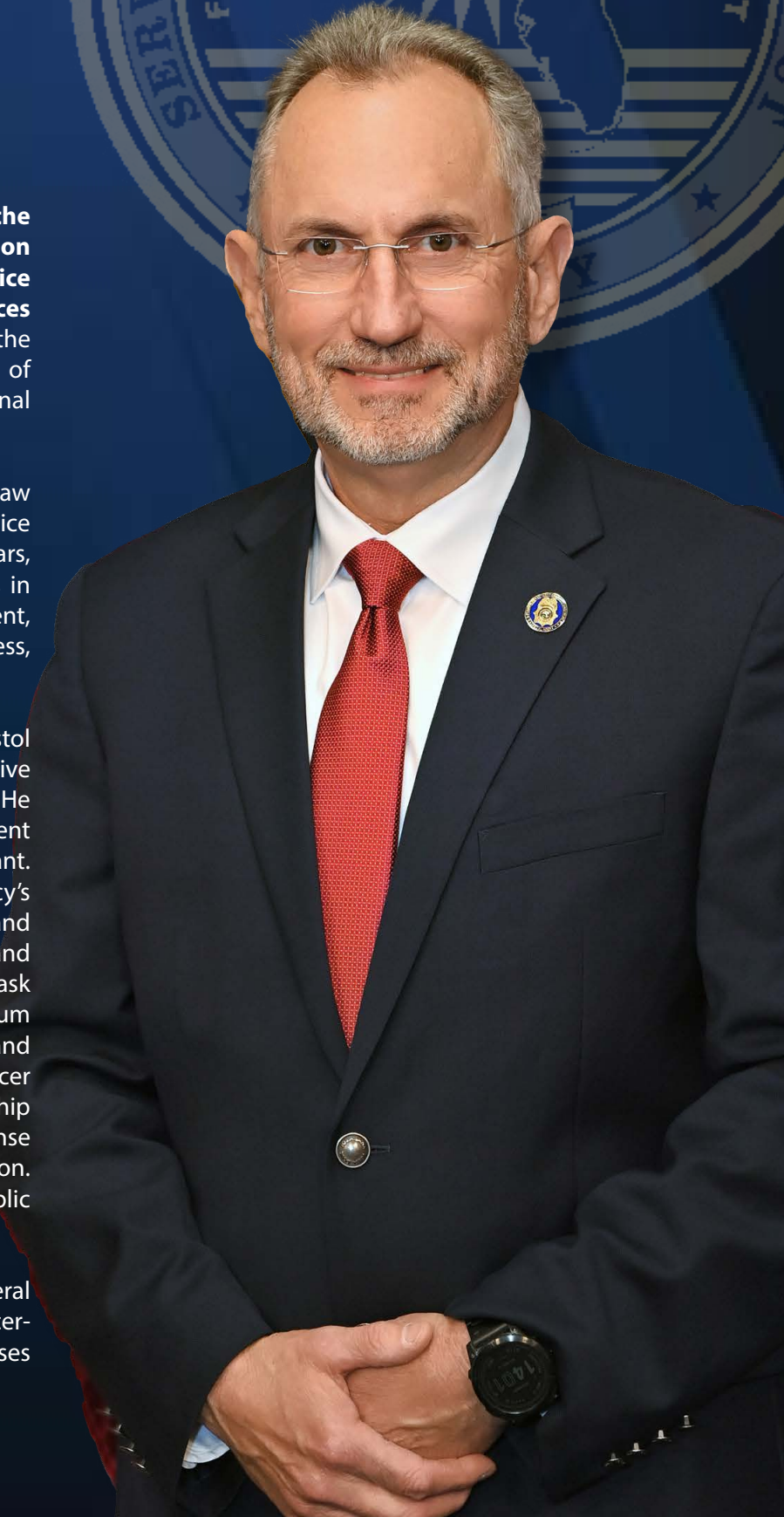
Steve Outlaw

Commissioner Glass is pleased to announce the appointment of Steve Outlaw to the position of Deputy Director of the Criminal Justice Professionalism, Standards & Training Services Division. He will oversee the Sworn Training Unit, the Bureau of Professional Development, the Bureau of Policy & Special Programs which includes the Criminal Justice Excellence unit.

Deputy Director Steve Outlaw began his law enforcement career with the Tallahassee Police Department (TPD) in 1987. After serving for 32 years, he retired in 2020. Deputy Director Outlaw's focus in his tenure was operations, training and development, individual and collective development, preparedness, and leadership.

Deputy Director Outlaw represented TPD as a pistol team member and actively taught firearms, defensive tactics, and driving techniques throughout his career. He was assigned to the Training section on three different occasions as an officer, sergeant, and lieutenant. As a training section officer, he was the agency's firearms training coordinator and chief armorer and was appointed to the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission (CJSTC) Defensive Tactics (DT) Task Force for several years to support a major DT curriculum rewrite. During his tenure as a training sergeant and lieutenant, he provided leadership on all new-officer and in-service development, instructor and leadership development, agency response doctrine, response equipment selection, as well as related policy creation. He was also an adjunct instructor at the Florida Public Safety Institute (FPSI).

Deputy Director Outlaw was called to testify in several grand juries regarding police procedures during officer-involved shootings and other high-profile responses during his time at TPD.





Deputy Director Steve Outlaw Continues

While at TPD, Deputy Director Outlaw served in several specialized assignments, including as a sniper, then entry-team member for the Tactical Apprehension and Control (TAC) Team and as commander for the Special Response Team (SRT). In addition, he led many patrol squads and the Gang Response Unit. His operational leadership roles included Watch Commander and Patrol Bureau Commander. In these roles, he led the response to many critical incidents and natural disasters.

He eventually retired as the interim chief of police in 2020. After his retirement, he remained a member of the TPD Reserve Program to continue teaching and mentoring his peers.

After retiring from TPD, Deputy Director Outlaw was appointed to the Training Section of the Division of Investigative and Forensic Services (DIFS) as a training program developer.

Deputy Director Outlaw then served as the Executive Director and Training Center Director of the Florida Public Safety Institute (FPSI) within the Tallahassee State College (TSC). FPSI facilitates all CJSTC programs, oversees the basic firefighter certification program for the surrounding region, as well as facilitates many Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and Mine Safety Grant Programs. FPSI is also the host training site for dozens of local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies.

Following his time at FPSI, Deputy Director Outlaw was asked to serve as the first Director of Operations and Provost Marshal for the Florida State Guard (FSG). There, he was instrumental in defining the scope of the missions, building interoperable relationships with other organizations, as well as building internal organizational systems.

Prior to his career at TPD, Deputy Director Outlaw served as a Security Police Officer in the United States Air Force from 1979 to 1987, with active-duty assignments in Germany and North Dakota.

After beginning his TPD career, Deputy Director Outlaw restarted his military career with the 20th Special Forces Group (Airborne) within the Florida National Guard. He served as a Senior Communications Sergeant (18E) on an Operational Detachment Alpha (ODA). He was deployed to many South American countries as well as to Afghanistan during 2003-2004. He eventually retired from the military after serving for 24 years.

Deputy Director Outlaw has been married to his wife, Kim, for 44 years. They have two adult children and four grandchildren.

FLORIDA MEDICAL EXAMINERS COMMISSION (MEC)

The Medical Examiners Act, Chapter 406, Florida Statutes, was enacted by the 1970 Legislature in order to establish minimum and uniform standards of excellence in statewide medical examiner services.

The Medical Examiners Commission (MEC) assesses if a violation of Chapter 406, Florida Statute, Rule 11G, Florida Administrative Code, or the Practice Guidelines for Florida Medical Examiners occurred.

- The MEC closed 4 complaints from January 1 to April 30, 2026. The complaints were determined to be not legally sufficient and were generally related to the cause and manner of death.

The medical examiner with jurisdiction determines the cause and manner of death after careful consideration using all the information provided to them.

Appointments and Reappointments of District Medical Examiners

Prior to the expiration of each incumbent district medical examiner's three year term of appointment, the Medical Examiners Commission staff survey the district's state attorney(s), public defender(s), sheriff(s), police chief(s), county commissioner(s), funeral home director(s) and a member of the local medical community.

The survey solicits input regarding the performance of the incumbent district medical examiner and asks for a "favorable", "non-favorable" or "no opinion" response regarding nomination for reappointment.

Additionally, the survey asks for suggestions for district medical examiner service improvements or recommendations for the nomination of the incumbent or any other qualified candidate(s) to serve as the district medical examiner.

Results will be presented at the Medical Examiners Commission meeting on May 12, 2026.



GRADUATION OF FLORIDA LEADERSHIP ACADEMY CLASS 62



The Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute (FCJEI) is proud to announce the graduation of the Florida Leadership Academy (FLA) Class 62 on April 24, 2026. The Fernandina Beach Police Department hosted the academy. Participants met for four week-long sessions from January to April. All 44 class participants serve in leadership roles that represent 37 criminal justice agencies throughout the state.

FLA's goal is to prepare first-line criminal justice supervisors to be effective leaders while also building the character and integrity of criminal justice professionals. FLA participants learn the skills necessary to support the needs of their agencies and communities.

The FCJEI will launch FLA Class 63 in May of 2026, which will be hosted by the Pasco County Sheriff's Office.

Updates

Advanced Course, #036, Injury and Death Investigations

On February 19, 2026, the Commission approved the revision of Advanced Course, #012, Injury and Death Investigations. The approval was effective immediately.

Updates to the course reflect contemporary methods and best practices for investigating death cases in the State of Florida. These updates include additional information on injury and death recognition, case-specific responses, scene management, scene reconstruction, working with third parties, and delivering death notifications. The SME workgroup also developed optional scenarios to help officers understand how to investigate some of the different types of death cases they are likely to encounter.

Specialized Course, #3031, Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) Course for Traffic Enforcement Camera Systems

On February 19, 2026, the Commission approved the new 24-hour Specialized Course, #3031, Selective Traffic Enforcement Program Course for Traffic Enforcement Camera Systems. The approval was effective immediately.

In 2023, House Bill 657 was approved by the legislature to require the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to set standards for speed detection systems (SDS) and authorize traffic infraction enforcement officers to enforce SDS school zone violations.

Commission staff worked with subject matter experts (SMEs) to develop a new curriculum to include instruction on how to enforce SDS school zone violations in addition to red-light camera violations. The new curriculum also includes updated notice of violation, affidavit, and uniform traffic citation examples for both camera system violations.

Retirement of Specialized Course, #1197, Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) Course for Red Light Cameras

On February 19, 2026, the Commission retired Specialized Course, #1197, Selective Traffic Enforcement Program Course for Red Light Cameras. The retirement was effective immediately.

The development and approval of the new Specialized Course, #3031, Selective Traffic Enforcement Program Course for Traffic Enforcement Camera Systems renders the Specialized Course, #1197, Selective Traffic Enforcement Program Course for Red Light Cameras obsolete.

While it is not mandatory for officers who completed the now retired course, #1197, to take the new course, #3031, agencies should ensure that their officers are trained on all traffic enforcement camera systems through the CJSTC course or a similar program as stated in s. 316.640(3), F.S.

Biennial Long Gun Qualification Update

The biennial long gun qualification for law enforcement officers who carry or operate a patrol rifle or shotgun previously referenced in Technical Memorandum 2025-09 and originally scheduled to begin on July 1, 2026, has been delayed. This delay is to allow additional validation of the qualification requirements by subject matter experts and user groups. The qualification requirement is anticipated to be effective on July 1, 2028.

More information about the long gun qualifications and the associated revision of form CJSTC-86A will be released in a different technical memorandum closer to the 2028 effective date. The delay of the biennial long gun qualification does not affect the following CJSTC-approved long gun courses:

- 1. Patrol Rifle Instructor Course, #3024**
- 2. Patrol Rifle Operator Course, #3026**
- 3. Shotgun Instructor Course, #3025**
- 4. Shotgun Operator Course, #3027**
