Patrol Rifle and Shotgun Instructor Course Roll-out Update



Since August of 2025, the subject matter experts (SMEs) who developed the new Commission-approved patrol rifle and shotgun courses have visited a handful of training schools around the state to teach current Commission-certified handgun instructors how to instruct the courses.



As of December 2025, there are 107 Commission-certified patrol rifle instructors and 100 Commission-certified shotgun instructors in state, and these numbers will continue to grow. As more instructors earn their certifications, agencies should begin to see more advertisements for the patrol rifle and shotgun instructor and operator classes.



Officers should understand that they are not required to attend or complete any of the new Commission-approved long gun courses. Additionally, officers do not need to become Commission-certified patrol rifle or shotgun instructors to teach their own agency-based long gun programs.

QUARTERLY UPDATE

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Advanced Violent Crime Investigator Course Revised

Commission staff worked with subject matter experts (SMEs) to update the curriculum to reflect contemporary methods and best practices for investigating violent crimes in the State of Florida. The SME workgroup also developed a series of optional and mandatory activities to help officers understand when to issue a search warrant, ask for a consent to search, and give a Miranda warning. While this course addresses how to investigate violent crimes, it can also be used to teach general investigative practices.

On October 30, 2025, the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission (CJSTC) approved the new course version (v.2025.10) which went into effect immediately. FLORIDA MEDICAL EXAMINERS COMMISSION (MEC)

The Medical Examiners Act, Chapter 406, Florida Statutes, was enacted by the 1970 Legislature in order to establish minimum and uniform standards of excellence in statewide medical examiner services.

The Medical Examiners Commission (MEC) assesses if a violation of Chapter 406, Florida Statute, Rule 11G, Florida Administrative Code, or the Practice Guidelines for Florida Medical Examiners occurred.

- The MEC closed 2 complaints from October 1 to December 31, 2025. The complaints were determined to be not legally sufficient and were generally related to the cause and manner of death.

The medical examiner with jurisdiction determines the cause and manner of death after careful consideration using all the information provided to them.

Unidentified Deceased Initiative

A joint initiative which began in 2006 between the Florida Department of Law Enforcement's (FDLE) Missing Endangered Persons Information Clearinghouse (MEPIC) and the Florida Medical Examiners Commission to identify Florida's unidentified deceased.

At the last Medical Examiners Commission Meeting held on October 28, 2025 in Kissimmee, Florida it was reported that District 17 (Broward County) were successfully able to establish the identify of 3 previous unidentified human remain cases.

- On September 19, 1983, remains were found in a rural area of western Broward County. All efforts to identify the remains yielded negative results. In June of 2025, with genetic genealogy, the unidentified human remains were identified and the family was notified.
- On January 24, 2005, remains were found in Broward County. Fingerprints were originally submitted and searched through local, state, and federal databases with negative results. In May of 2025, law enforcement worked with Homeland Security and were able to identify the decedent through an immigration file. The decedent's family was notified.
- On August 10, 2016, remains were found in Fort Lauderdale. The decedent's fingerprints were submitted and searched through local, state, and federal databases with negative results. DNA was submitted into CODIS with no results. In August of 2025, the FBI began automating old civil and military files into Next Generation Identification (NGI) and was able to positively identify the decedent. The decedent's family was notified.

MISSING & PERSONS

Unidentified Human Remains



Florida's Law Enforcement Agencies and Medical Examiners Offices (MEO) experienced an outage of services for DNA analysis for Missing Persons and Unidentified Human Remains (MUHR) beginning in approximately 2019. At the time, FDLE's Regional Crime Laboratories generally only accepted these cases for direct comparison between a UHR and a reference sample or a parent/child of the decedent. In July 2023, all FDLE Regional Crime Laboratories reinstated DNA testing for Relatives of Missing Persons (RMP), followed by acceptance of Unidentified Persons or UHRs in October 2023. RMP and UHR samples are subject to STR DNA testing and Y-STR DNA testing (where applicable) for entry into CODIS. So far, sixteen (16) identifications have been made through CODIS matches, with two (2) more aided through CODIS and additional mtDNA testing.

With the assistance of Federal BJA Missing and Unidentified Human Remains (FY22 MUHR) grant funds (*15PBJA-22-GG-0409-MISP), FDLE has been able to process UHR cases using Forensic Investigative Genetic Genealogy (FIGG) when no CODIS associations were obtained. This funding is restricted to UHRs reasonably believed to be the victim of a homicide. More than 80 UHR cases have been assessed, and SNP DNA sequencing and genetic genealogy research continues with many samples in the pipeline. FDLE has secured an extension for this grant through September 2026, with 16 cases in the testing process and 19 undergoing genetic genealogy research. Ten (10) FIGG-related identifications have been accepted.

[Section 943.327, F.S.](#), was established in 2024 and permitted use of funds for FIGG for Doe cases not related to a homicide. Many MEO secured passthrough funds for FIGG cases via the [State FIGG Grant Program](#) to engage with vendors on their own. No appropriation was made for this program for FY25-26, but FDLE Forensics is hopeful for future funding. FDLE Forensics assumed grantee status through this program as well, accepting 17 Doe cases into its FIGG Program on behalf of five sheriff's offices, the Florida Highway Patrol, two police departments, and one MEO. These cases are presently in various stages of testing and research, and three (3) have resulted in identifications. Funds were reverted and re-appropriated, allowing for use of the available dollars through June 2026.

As a service provider, FDLE Forensics does not engage in case announcements. The investigating agencies and families are the true customers. However, without separating the variety of successes by funding source or technology, FDLE Forensics has engaged in aiding 50 identifications through Direct Comparisons, CODIS, NGI (fingerprints), and FIGG.

FDLE Genetic Genealogy Investigations Unit funds have also been utilized to identify some homicide victims. This in-house FDLE GGI Team has participated in more than 10 FIGG-based UHR identifications. Vendor partners include Othram, Inc. for SNP DNA testing and genetic genealogy research and Bode Technology for mitochondrial DNA testing.

The FCJEI will launch FLA Class 62 in January of 2026, which will be hosted by the Fernandina Beach Police Department.
